

To Whom It May Concern:

The State of California has elected to be insured for its motor vehicle and general liability exposures through a self-insurance program. The State Attorney General administers the general liability program through an annual appropriation from the General Fund. The Office of Risk and Insurance Management administers the motor vehicle liability program.

Under this form of insurance, the State and its employees (as defined in Section 810.2 of the Government Code) are insured for any tort liability that may develop through carrying out official activities, including state official operations on non-state owned property. Should any claims arise by reason of such operations or under an official contract or license agreement, they should be referred to the Attorney General, State of California, Tort Liability Section, 1300 I Street, Suite 1101, PO Box 944255, Sacramento, CA 94244-2550.

The State of California has entered into a Master Agreement with the State Compensation Insurance Fund to administer workers' compensation benefits for all state employees, as required by the Labor Code.

Dear Ms. Baker,

The attached Road Closure Permit request is to accommodate the "Every 15 Minutes" safety presentation at Oak Ridge High School on April 6, 2010. The program is organized by the El Dorado Hills Fire Department, California Highway Patrol and Oak Ridge High School.

The program includes a "staged" collision scene that will be set on Harvard Way in front of the High School. Emergency personnel from the fire department, El Dorado County Coroners Office and CHP (including helicopter medivac) will create and enact a "real life" collision scene, including patient extrication, medical care, arrest of DUI driver and medivac of an injured party. Junior and senior students from Oak Ridge will be located in bleachers adjacent to the collision scene and observe the real life emergency scene.

Harvard way will be closed for only three hours. The road closure will be managed by CHP personnel throughout the entire event. Officers will be on hand at each road closure to direct traffic, prohibit pedestrian traffic and give directions for alternate routes. We are not anticipating any major traffic problems as there are no commercial businesses in the area. The traffic management plan will only prohibit vehicles from accessing Oak Ridge High School. The local neighborhood will not be adversely affected.
