I appreciate the opportunity to address you today regarding the critical decisions surrounding cannabis regulation. It is paramount to recognize the resounding voice of your constituents, with 65% expressing their support for the legalization of cannabis. Their collective will should serve as the guiding force in your considerations.

1. Tannebarn BUS V30/2024

Let's delve into the pivotal role of the Planning Commission. The Commission, backed by a majority vote, put forth additional changes to the cannabis ordinance. Stakeholders, presenting compelling arguments during the Commission hearing, led to the proposal of modifications that were not only logical but also received consensus through a democratic process. Unfortunately, staff's decision not to present these proposals to you amounts to a disregard for the collaborative decision-making process and an overstep of their responsibilities.

The inconsistency in applying Common Sense CEQA guidelines is disconcerting. Staff claims that proposed changes from the Planning Commission violate these guidelines, citing environmental impacts. However, these changes are grounded in common sense, carrying zero environmental impact. The Planning Commission's recommendations, driven by logic, stand in stark contrast to staff's decisions. It raises questions when staff permits the use of the Common Sense CEQA clause for the new Vegetation Management Ordinance but denies it for cannabis ordinance changes.

Supervisor Turnboo, your insightful words during the board meeting on September 12, 2023, emphasized the potential benefits of cannabis legalization, from eliminating the black market to fostering a green market with lab-tested products and environmentally sound practices. The proposed changes align seamlessly with these objectives, yet staff is inexplicably sidelining them from discussion. This inconsistency contradicts your vision articulated during that crucial meeting.

Quoting County Counsel Billingsley, the Board cannot direct the Planning Commission to include only the items recommended by the Board. This underscores the importance of respecting and trusting the collaborative decisions made by the Planning Commission.

Acknowledging the flaws in the current cannabis ordinance is the first step, but it's essential not to take half measures in addressing them. The positive changes proposed and voted on by the Planning Commission are at your disposal, ready for implementation. Trust in the Planning Commission's expertise and the democratic

process that has led to their recommendations. Let us not falter in your commitment to fulfilling the will of the voters and ensuring a fair and just cannabis regulation.

Lastly, the proposal from the county Tax Collector for a flat gross sales tax for all cannabis operations deserves your attention. I urge you to consider and incorporate this fair and straightforward tax structure for the betterment of our community.

In conclusion, I implore you to trust in the Planning Commission's decisions, prioritize the collective voice of the constituents, and address the inconsistencies in staff decisions. Let us stand firm in our commitment to making the will of the voters a tangible reality.

At the very least, please insure we have a fixed date today for phase 2 of the ordinance revision
