





Psychiatric Health Facility (Chris Kernes/Moriah Weldy)

- There were 36 Admissions; 18 Admissions were El Dorado County residents and 18 were Out of County residents.
- There were El Dorado County residents discharged; 12 to Home with Support, 0 to Home without support, **0** MHRC/IMD, **3** Board and Care, **0** to ICM T-House, **0** to Shelter, **3** to Other, and **0** to Emergency Department.
- Upon discharge, 15 El Dorado County residents were insured and 3 El Dorado County residents were pending insurance.
- There were 2 Seclusion Episodes, 0 Physical Restraint Episodes, 1 Assaults, 0 Elopements, 2 Medication Errors (0 medication errors with no patient involvement), Client Surveys 22
- There were **2** denials of El Dorado County referrals: 2 minors
- Average daily census was **12** (range 7-14) with **9.91** average length of stay of days.
- Concurrent Reviews resulting in no medical necessity found.






- Formal STACS meetings have started back up. First meetings were attended by a core team, and additional members have been identified to be invited.

QUALITY ASSURANCE & PATIENT RIGHTS

Quality Improvement / Utilization Review (Justine Collinsworth)

- The QM team conducted audits of our children's SMHS contract providers' client charts based on CalAIM Documentation and Payment Reform standards. Each agency was found to be within 90% to 100% compliance with all given standards of care for charting. This audit gave the QM team an opportunity to connect with each provider and discuss ongoing technical assistance for CalAIM reform.
- Much of the month has been spent in preparation for submitting information to DHCS regarding the outcomes of CalAIM reform (i.e. implementation of the Screening and Transition of Care Tools, implementation of Performance Improvement Projects).

5150 Hearing (AB2275) This new law became effective on January 1, 2023. EDC held its first hearing 5150 hearing on February 27, 2023.

EDCBH has implemented a process to facilitate a due process hearing no later than 7 days from the initial detainment. A Certification Review Hearing is to be held at the ED (MMC/Barton), if a client continues to meet criteria for a 5150, and has been placed on a second hold, until transfer and placement arrangements to a LPS designated facility are completed or the hold is lifted.

PROGRAM ACTIVITY UPDATES

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES (Salina Drennan)

- The Access team continues to work to streamline process that reduce wait times for services. The direct scheduling process implemented in July 2023 has been largely successful. The Emergency Room Follow-up process has been successful. 12 Clients have been directly referred from the Emergency Department. 9 out of 12 beneficiaries assessed by credentialed hospital staff, or 75%, received a follow up service within 7 days of entering the E.D., 12 or out 12, or 100%, received a follow up service within 30 days of entering the E.D.
- The QA team continues to work with providers to help them ensure quality of services. Our QA program is working diligently on multiple projects, as per usual. We are finalizing our UR Audit results in preparation for high-level report to DHCS for our BHQIP reporting requirement at the end of September 2023.

 The Pharmacotherapy for Opioid use disorder (POD) project and described in the previous BHC update have been fully implemented as of August 10, 2023. The intervention has been utilized on 3 patients at Aegis, making it too early to report on any data, but subsequent reports will include KPI data as more comes in.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA) (Meredith Zanardi)

- Community Program Planning Process (CPPP) FY 24/25 Annual Update
 - Began holding MHSA Community Meetings open to the public in a variety of in person and virtual formats.
- Development continues for several PEI contracts as part of the FY 23-26 Three Year Plan
- On August 15, 2023 the Board of Supervisors approved five Children's Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS) contracts in support of the Children's Full Service Partnership (FSP) project, following updated CalAIM requirements.
- MHSA Reform:
 - Continue to attend information sessions to better understand the implications of SB 326 and potential impacts to the El Dorado County system of care.

Suicide Prevention (Nicole Ebrahimi-Nuyken/Meredith Zanardi)

- Continued discussion around implementation of the Suicide Prevention Strategic Plan

ADULT OUTPATIENT SERVICES (Jody Kwachak-Hall (SLT); Danielle Bogan/John Schumacher (WS))

Tahoe:

- Adult Outpatient Clinicians and Mental Health Workers actively work with Clients to provide MH services in the office, in Clients' homes, by telephone and by telehealth. The Clinicians and Mental Health Workers provide services in community settings.
- SLT has 4 F/T & 1 extra-help Clinicians, and 3 F/T & 1 P/T Mental Health Workers providing services to 177 outpatient Clients.

West Slope:

 Individualized services are provided to adults 18 years and older who meet criteria for Specialty Mental Health Services by a multidisciplinary team of Psychiatrists, Nurses, Mental Health Clinicians, and Mental Health Workers/Aides. Services include screenings, assessments, medication evaluations, co-occurring assessments and treatment groups, individual therapy, group therapy and case management services and supports.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES (Angelina Larrigan)

New Children's SMHS contracts went into effect to reflect DHCS CalAIM guidance and rate structure changes. This has been challenging for all involved due to HHSA getting up to speed on new processes and invoices, billing logistics, old contracts remaining in our backbone program Fenix, EHR Avatar, missing language in new contracts prohibiting our contractors from billing and therefor being reimbursed for necessary services for our consumers, etc. These barriers will take time to resolve which will ultimately create a hardship for our contractors, consumers and partnership.

Sierra Children and Family Services- Moving South Lake Tahoe office and we are projecting an October opening. We are also closing our El Dorado Hills office.

Stanford Sierra Youth Solutions- Connected over 70 families with backpacks to start the new school year! Anthony Rodriquez Contreras to program manager and hired 2 clinicians, 2 family specialists and 1 facilitator.
