



El Dorado County Tree Removal Program for Low-Income Seniors



Financial assistance for low-income senior homeowners to remove dead or dying trees threatening their home is available through El Dorado County Planning and Building Department, Housing, Community and Economic Development Program (HCED) with funding through a grant from the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CALFIRE). The grant funding is limited and available to El Dorado County property owners who meet the following eligibility criteria:


Maximum Household Income Limits

60% Area Median Income
Effective 5/24/16

1 Person	\$31,950
2 Persons	\$36,540
3 Persons	\$41,100
4 Persons	\$45,660

*Limits for larger household sizes available. See *contact information below*.

- Household must be low-income as defined by household size
 See *Maximum Household Income Limits*
- Residence must be properly permitted and owner-occupied by person(s) at least 60 years of age
- Property must be in a high fire hazard area
- Affected trees within 300 feet of dwelling must be determined to pose a threat to an inhabited structure by a professional Forester/Arborist (provided by the County)
- Program allows for removal of a maximum of two dead/dying trees that pose a threat per eligible property
