Assistant Director Update (Patricia Charles-Heathers)

- During the month of December, I worked closely with the Telecare and HHSA PHF
 Transition Team on the processes needing to be in place in order to ensure a
 smooth transition between Telecare and the Mental Health Division. To guarantee
 quick placement and avoid any crises, we also contracted for a dedicated bed with
 North Valley Behavioral Health from January 6, 2015 through January 31, 2015.
- The Mental Health Managers worked closely with Dr. Price to ensure a smooth hand off of clients who were at the PHF, and ensured that the PHF was empty by the end of the work day on January 5, 2015. All clients were appropriately discharged and/or transferred accordingly, so that construction could begin at the PHF on January 6, 2015.
- In December, Jamie Samboceti and Doris Jones provided training to the Telecare Social Workers and Lead Nurses on the 5150 process.

Tahoe:

- Our Wellness Center has recently begun a new group on Fridays based on the book "Change your Brain, Change your Life," by Dr Daniel Amen. The group is designed to assist individuals in understanding how different regions of the brain look when functioning optimally and symptoms that occur when these regions are overactive and underactive. The group explores various interventions such as diet, exercise, cognitive skills, herbs and medications. This group is being facilitated by our new intern Emily Bennett.
- We now have a Psychiatric Technician, Daniel Joaquin, working with us two days per week assisting Dr. Malik and our Clinicians to ensure clients medication needs are being managed well.
- Our ICM team in now fully staffed, our third Clinician, Teddi Plummer, recently joined us and is currently in training.
- We are working with Shirley White, Manager of Alcohol and Drug Programs, to improve SLT's Behavioral Health Court and ensure fidelity of the courts between the two slopes.
- We currently have 1 opening for a Full Time Clinician.

West Slope:

 The Wellness Center is currently evaluating the group schedule to determine availability of current groups and anticipated need of future groups as we look to budget preparations for FY 15/16. The 'Performance Group' is set to begin a new

- cycle and the Clinic Team is recruiting a new group of clients to participate in this highly effective socialization activity.
- A Psychiatric Technician has now been assigned to assist with Case Management of our Out-of-County Board & Care clients, to ensure all their psychiatric medication and medical needs are being met in accordance with the client's individual treatment plans.
- The long awaited 'Resource Specialist' position on the ICM team has been filled and work is already underway to build independent living and employment resources for clients served by the ICM team.

 SLT Wellness Center had two holiday meals: one for Thanksgiving and the other for Christmas/Winter Solstice. They were well attended and clients expressed gratitude to the staff and NAMI who contributed their time and resources to make these events happen.

West Slope

Children Outpatient Services (Jamie Samboceti)

There are approximately 315 WS active child cases with our Contract Providers.

Psychiatric Emergency Services (Jamie Samboceti and Sabrina Owen)

- PES continues to be very busy on both slopes.
- SLT in the last 30 days: 32 crisis assessments, 10 hospitalized (1 open client), 2 referred to Substance Abuse Treatment
- WS in the last 30 days: 75 crisis assessments, 43 hospitalized (9 open clients), 21 referred to Substance Abuse Treatment

Crisis Intervention Teams (CIT) (Jamie Samboceti and Sabrina Owen)

- CIT officers in Tahoe work closely with our ICM team to provide collaborative, quality care in the field for our clients.
- CIT on WS continues to assign home visits by CIT trained officers for those who
 have had a 5150 written by EDSO. They are building strong relationships in our
 community with our clients and those who may become our clients.
- We connect with CIT when there is concern about someone in our community. They
 will assign a CIT officer to do a welfare check as needed.
- CIT has a plan to provide local training to officers in the next few months. Many are completing 24 hours of training.

Psychiatric Health Facility (Doris Jones)

November 2014:

- There were 26 Admissions.
- 24 Admissions were El Dorado County residents and 2 were Out of County clients.
- There were 20 El Dorado County residents discharged in November, 2014; 10 to home with support; 4 to home without support; 3 to Adult Residential Facilities; 0 to Skilled Nursing Facilities; 0 to Board and Care Homes; 0 to local T-Houses; 0 to Jail; 2 to Shelters: 1 to Other: AWOL.
- Upon Discharge, **20** El Dorado County residents were insured
- During the month of November, there were 5 seclusion episodes all together totaling
 9 hours.

December 2014:

- There were **24** Admissions.
- 22 Admissions were El Dorado County residents and 2 were Out of County clients.
- There were 28 El Dorado County residents discharged in December, 2014; 16 to home with support; 4 to home without support; 3 to Adult Residential Facilities; 0 to

- Skilled Nursing Facilities; **0** to Board and Care Homes; **4** to local T-Houses; **1** to Jail; **0** to Shelters.
- Upon Discharge, 26 El Dorado County residents were insured
- During the month of December, there was 1 seclusion episode all together totaling 4 hours.

MHSA (Ren Scammon)

- The initial meetings for the FY 15/16 Community Planning Process wrapped up in December 2014. Input impacting the budget was requested to be submitted by January 9, 2015 so that it could be included in the Division's budget requests. The public will have an opportunity to continue to provide comment through Public Hearing that is anticipated to be held in May or June 2015. Development of the FY 15/16 MHSA budget and Plan Update are the primary focus of the MHSA Team at this time.
- The MHSA Team is working closely with our Quality Management Team to develop
 a joint meeting of the Quality Improvement Committee and the MHSA Advisory
 Board. Both groups have the same categories of stakeholder participants and are
 tasked with similar activities (such as reviewing outcomes, access to services, and
 program implementation). We anticipate holding the first meeting of this combined
 group in March. More information will be forthcoming.
- In November 2014, the Provider Cultural Competency meeting received an
 informative presentation from Hector Reyes, a Supervisor within the County's
 Alcohol and Drug Programs, about the current culture and trends in El Dorado
 County relating to drug use among the youth population. In January 2015, the topic
 is on how to access interpreter services for non-English speaking clients and public
 inquiries.

Behavioral Health Court (Shirley White)

- Placerville Behavioral Health Court has 10 active participants; 1 successful
 graduation in December and 2 new referrals pending assessments. Lisa Arnold is
 the new Program Manager for Justice Services and will be serving the Behavioral
 Health Court.
- South Lake Tahoe Behavioral Health Court has 3 active participants; no graduations in December and 2 new referrals were declined.

AB 109 (Shirley White)

• 1 client will be transitioning from the jail to Residential Substance Abuse Treatment this week. A total of 3 AB 109 clients are receiving Residential Substance Abuse Treatment. These clients are being given additional support to create transitional plans to ensure that they are successful when they return to CCC services. A total of 42 clients are receiving services at the Community Corrections Center. South Lake Tahoe is serving 10 clients in the Moral Reconation Therapy group in the jail.

Patients' Rights Advocate (Doris Jones)

Mental Health Grievances to date for FY 14/15; 8 grievances have been received, 8 have been completed. There are 0 outstanding grievances to be assigned for investigation with outcomes pending.

- Ongoing Client Advocacy with Psychiatric Health Facility, Mental Health, Public Guardian and other County and Departments and community-based organizations regarding Mental Health Client needs, requests, issues and rights.
- Psychiatric Health Facility weekday presence at the facility to provide advocacy, support, information, and education to Mental Health Clients, Client's family and support system members and Agency staff; attend Care Team meetings, staffings and to represent Clients at Certification Review Hearings.
- Ongoing advocacy for the implementation of policies and procedures that coincide with applicable codes, regulations, laws and mental health patients' rights.
- Ongoing resources, information, education, consultation and training materials provided for Health and Human Services and Telecare staff.
- Mental Health Sites Safety Coordination with all Mental Health facility sites regarding safety issues and to ensure quarterly fire drills are scheduled, held and documented as well as periodic facility safety inspections per County guidelines.
- County-Wide Safety Coordinator: Attend quarterly meetings, participate in projects, complete all required follow-up, provide updates and information to Mental Health Site Safety Team Members.
