I submit this written correspondence to you to be included as part of record for the August 27, 2024 County of El Dorado Board of Supervisors Meeting Agenda item 13 regarding an update of the formation of a Tahoe South Shore Transit Joint Powers Authority (JPA) between the City of South Lake Tahoe and El Dorado County.

I would like to first thank the County staff for their participation and contributions to discussions regarding the formation of a Transit JPA for the Tahoe South Shore Area. Progress is being made and on track for a draft JPA agreement to be presented at the joint Board of Supervisors and City Council meeting on October 15th.
