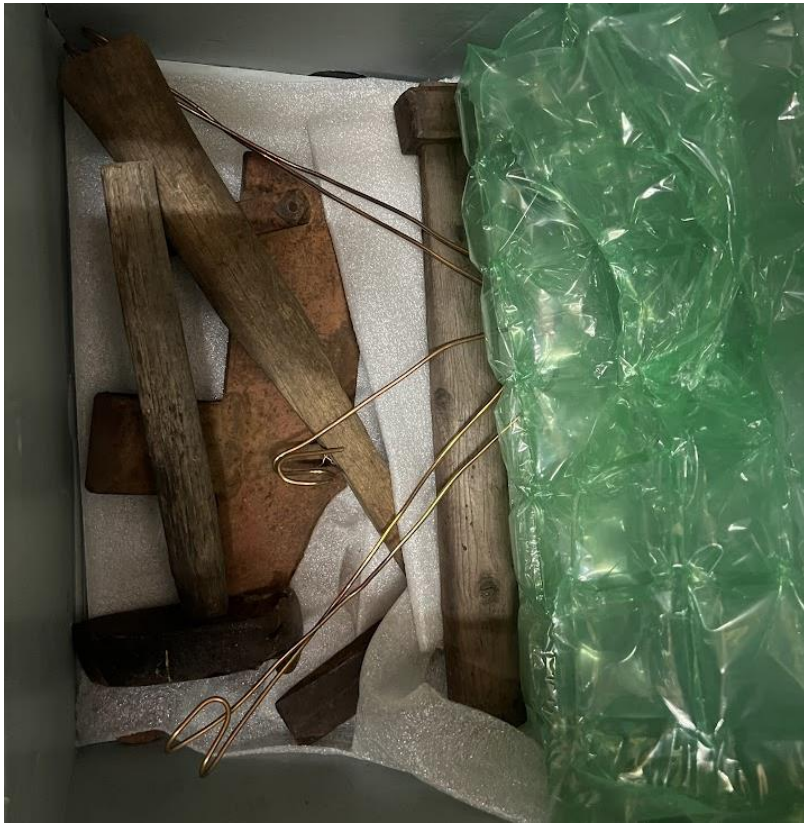

Box #1: Identify whether the table parts can be located and then bring the table back to the Commission for review.

Box #2: Reise-Kopierrolle, bottles, and various early-to-mid-20th-century artifacts.;	No.	Box #2 No	For some items	Box #2 contains a few artifacts related to documentation and domestic life. The box features a cylindrical item labeled Reise-Kopierrolle (German for "Travel Copy Roll"), which is a portable container for a copying or duplicating roll. In context with the other items, it is likely from the early 20th Century and is in Fair condition. Includes several glassware items, including a Wicker/Raffia-Covered Bottle (Fiasco) used for wine in Good condition. An open dark wine bottle, likely a Bordeaux style from the early 20th-century, is present with a heavily distressed capsule, classifying its condition as Acceptable. Miscellaneous items include a glass Mustard Jar from the 1930s–1950s in Fair condition, a metal Sheriff's Badge (late 19th-century style or replica) in Fair to Good condition, and a metal Candle Holder/Candlestick, likely dating from the post-1920s era, is also in Good condition.	Box #2: Deaccession. The items do not meet the collection objectives of the museum. In particular, the quality, rarity, and relevance of the items are not present for this collection.

Box #3: A note with the bottles indicates they were found on property on Spanish Ravine Rd. and were brought to the museum on 6/18/14 by Alice Crocker.	No.	Box #3: contains a note from Alice Crocker indicating that they were found on her property.	For some items	Box #3 features several glassware items, including a small Amber Glass Bottle (a medicine or bitters bottle from the early 20th century, given its cap) in Good condition, and a larger Clear Glass Bottle with a rounded top (a late 19th-century soda or liquor bottle, missing its stopper) also in Good condition. The box is rounded out by a small Vial or Pharmacy Sample Bottle (19th century) in Good condition.	Box #3: ACCESSION the two 19th-century bottles for further review. Can the bottle manufacturers be determined? If additional information comes to light, then re-assess whether the bottles should be maintained in the collection. DEACCESSION the 20th-century bottles. Outside of the two 19th-century bottles, the items do not meet the collection objectives of the museum. In particular, the quality, rarity, and relevance of the items are not present for this collection.
