As long time residents (1978) of Sly Park Hills my husband and I would like to go on record that we do not support a cell phone tower in Sly Park Hills. We have concerns about health risks, property value going down and natural surroundings being destroyed.

- This tower will be visible for miles and will destroy the view for many of our neighbors. We like to be surrounded by nature, which is the reason we purchased land here.
- Children will be walking to and from the bus stops and will pass the tower daily. What are the health risks to growing and developing bodies?
- As there is only one way in and one way out of Sly Park Hills all residents will be forced to drive by the tower when entering and leaving the subdivision. What are our health risks?
- Realtors have stated that property value drops 25% due to cell towers.
- We don't feel we need a tower. We have cell coverage and have never had difficulty receiving or making a call out. I worked from home for over 3 years without issue.
- During the Caldor Fire emergency communication was flawless. The fire was very close to our homes and yet cell phones and home cameras functioned properly. Were emergency notifications not received by neighbors due to poor cell coverage?
- Prior to cell phones we used lan lines. AT&T provided extremely unreliable service. Our lan line was out every time it rained. Per AT&T it was never the rain that actually caused the outage. They found bats, or squirrels or ants living in their equipment but they seemed to only present a problem when it rained. I'll never understand that but what is going to stop the same thing happening in the cell tower?
- The proposed cell tower is going to be 140 feet in height. We don't have trees in Sly Park Hills that are any where near that height. I'm not an arborist but I would be surprised if there are trees taller than 80 feet in Sly Park Hills and the nearby area. The tower will be an eyesore and will not blend in to the surrounding area.

Please reconsider this permit. Sly Park Hills has many needs but a 140 foot cell tower is not one of them.
