Subject: Grizzly Flat Road Repairs Emergency Action Terminated

Please accept this memo as the update and termination of emergency action for the Grizzly Flat Road Repairs project.

SUMMARY

The Department of Transportation, Maintenance, and Operations staff (Transportation) identified approximately 970,000 square feet of County maintained roadway that needs to be repaired prior to Winter 2022.

Based on Public Contract Code section 22050, the Board adopted Resolution #116-2022 on July 26, 2022, under Legistar #22-1341, finding an emergency existed due to the Caldor Fire debris removal efforts which resulted in damage to County maintained roads in the Grizzly Flats area and authorized the Director of Transportation to take all necessary actions to approve the design and specifications and to authorize to advertise bids for the emergency repair project. Transportation developed bid documents, with the approval of County Counsel, and advertised the project. Subsequently, on August 23, 2022, under Legistar #22-1418, the Board adopted Resolution 162-2022 that further delegated to the Director of Transportation the authority to take all necessary actions to approve and award a contract to the lowest and most responsible bidder for the emergency repair projects.

The competitive bid closed on August 31, 2022. Transportation identified the lowest responsive bidder, Teichert Construction. Prior to the appeal period concluding, one response was received. Therefore, Transportation took Legistar #22-1593 to the Board of Supervisors on September 13, 2022, awarding the contract to Teichert Construction. Transportation staff then conducted a pre-construction meeting with Teichert Construction. At the pre-construction meeting, Transportation learned the road repair work is scheduled to begin on October 10, 2022, and Teichert Construction anticipates completing the repairs within the specified timeline listed in the agreement.

Public Contract Code section 22050(c)(2) authorizes the Director of Transportation to terminate the emergency action at the earliest date that conditions warrant. With the contract bidding and award process completed as of September 13, 2022, and a fully-executed contract in place on September 26, 2022, the emergency repair project contracting process has been completed. The Director of Transportation has thus determined that the emergency action is now terminated as of September 26, 2022.
