WELCOME TO EL DORADO COUNTY

A benefit for vacation home renters is the peace that permanent residents enjoy year round. It is an extraordinary feeling to view the beauty of nature in quiet and safe surroundings. We hope that you too will embrace this special sense of being close to nature.

This means you too must be a good visitor and protect your neighbor's peace and repose.

Guests please keep in mind that you may be contacted for creating a noise disturbance or violating any of the provisions of the County Vacation Home Rental Ordinance Chapter 5.56. Your permanent neighbors have a right to peace and repose and this must be respected at all times of the day but especially into the evening hours. Neighbors have the Vacation Rental Hotline number and will call should an issue arise.

This brochure is intended to highlight a few ways to ensure that your stay is an enjoyable one and remind every visitor to be a **good guest** during your stay in El Dorado County.

HOW TO BE A GOOD VISITOR

Noise:

Please do not play loud music, engage in disorderly conduct or create noise that can be heard at the property line. Consider how you would want guests to act in your neighborhood back home.

Parking and Snow Conditions:

It is important that you park in the designated parking areas as permitted for your rental. Never at any time block or park in another's driveway. In the Tahoe Basin, parking shall be on a paved surface only.

From November 1 to May 1st, no street parking is allowed at any time. Do **NOT** park on the street during snow conditions. It is important that local snow removal equipment and emergency vehicles are not obstructed. If your car is left on the street during snow conditions, it will be cited and possibly towed.

Garbage:

Bears and other wildlife can be attracted to garbage and we care about your safety. In Tahoe, never leave trash outside unless it is placed in a trash can in a bear resistant container. Please review the trash pick up date on your rental agreement.

Pets:

Dogs must be on a leash whenever they are outside. Unattended dogs can disturb the neighbors by barking and whining. Please attend to your pets.

Occupancy:

Please verify the maximum number of permitted occupants for your vacation home. Exceeding the number posted on the vacation home rental permit is a violation of the County Ordinance. Limited occupancy is for everyone's health and safety. Each child 6 years old and older is counted.

Quiet Hours - Backyards, Decks and Hot Tubs:

Most likely, your neighbors are not on vacation. Because voices carry in the high altitude air, please take special care while in the hot tub or in the backyard that your laughter, music and conversations can't be heard at the property line. Use of outdoor hot tubs or noise that is heard over the property line after 10:00 P.M. is a violation under the County Ordinance.

Barbecuing and Burning:

Wood burning campfires and briquette barbecues are not allowed at any time. Gas appliances and gas barbecues are allowed when there is no red flag warning. Check for red flag warnings at: www.weather.gov/fire
