

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
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

Dear Sir/Madam of the Board of Supervisors,

First I wish to acknowledge and thank Supervisor Ray Nutting for coming to the Senior Center Nutrition Program and to discuss with us concerns before the Board of Supervisor and the one proposal in consideration in the budget to withdraw all funding for our EDH senior lunch program beginning on 1 January 2011. I feel we all gathered a greater understanding as to the very real concerns facing you. He also gave us a sense of peace that you did understand our concerns and an appreciation for how much Moni Gilmore worked and fought over the years on behalf of the senior community of El Dorado Hills.

I still feel I must express my personal concerns to you with regards to this issue. Many local residents rely on the benefits from the lunch program. As beneficial as a nutritious and balanced daily meal is, there are many other equally necessary benefits: being in a social setting, in the company of peers, sharing joyous experiences as well as getting support and comfort during trying times. Many live alone, many are on a meager income, and some with limited use or movement of their bodies. The social aspects of the eating with others is a benefit for the brain and personal esteem, thus contributing to the wellness of the Senior and carries over into the society as a whole.

During the last two years, the county has closed one program in our area, Shingle Springs. Several of those seniors have had the means of transporting themselves to our El Dorado Hills facility, others just can't come. If you close any of these proposed sites as well as El Dorado Hills Nutrition Program, where will these people go. As a whole they will not or can not travel to Placerville or So Lake Tahoe sites. This puts a burden on one facility, the roads, gasoline and elderly driving when maybe they should not. The saddest of all is the loss of a nutritious daily meal that they need for their physical well being.

At this point also reconsider the idea of contracting out the homebound meals on wheels program. This program has many volunteers who service those in need. On more than one occasion they have found an emergency when stopping that they can get help for the senior. Then for many that is the only outside social outlet they have and it means so much to them to see that someone cares for them.
