Air Quality Management District

- Requested/Received additional funding from DCSS for a generator for the leased facility, enabling CS to remain open during PSPS outages.
- Requested/received additional funding for two outreach vehicles to serve customers in outlying areas.

Child Support

- Working with Public Guardian & Adult Protective Services to establish protocols for information sharing and joint efforts for elder and dependent adults. Also worked w/ partners outside the County, incl. State agencies, health care providers, and placement facilities.
- Working with the courts, DA, Public Defender & HHSA to address the role of mental health in homelessness, including use of LPS conservatorships.
