- Obtaining a Medical Home 385 children with Medi-Cal were accepted into primary care practices between 2007 -2009
- ➤ Utilizing a Medical Home 144 newborns on Medi-Cal successfully completed their immunizations/well child visits between 2007-2009
- Pediatric Mental Health Consult 75 children were successfully referred from primary care physicians to mental health services between 2006 -2009

Dental Van

- First 5 El Dorado will facilitate the partnership and purchase the dental van
- The El Dorado County Health Services Department, Children's Health Initiative will lead the collaborative and coordinate services for families
- The Shingle Springs Tribal Health Program will provide dental services
- The El Dorado County Office of Education will provide operational support for the van





Dental Van

(continued)

- Will serve as a dental home for children zero through five-years of age in El Dorado County
- Target population is families whose children receive Medi-Cal benefits or have no dental insurance
- Will be parked in 6-7 strategic locations throughout the County, twice yearly
- Collaborative will be convened to address treatment needs for other children and to develop a referral system
