# PART IV PROGRAM NARRATIVE

## 1. **OBJECTIVES**

An Application for Federal Aviation Administration Airport Improvement Program funds has been prepared for the construction of the New Beacon Tower and Beacon project proposed to be included in the 2025 Airport Improvement Program at the Georgetown Airport. The project description is as follows:

The existing beacon is old, difficult to maintain, and replacement parts are often difficult to obtain. The existing tower is old and has significant safety concerns. It is proposed to install a new beacon on a new tip down tower at the existing tower site at the Georgetown Airport.

The proposed project includes the engineering design of the following:

- Construct a new tower foundation at the site of the existing tower.
- Erect new 55-foot tip-down beacon tower.
- Replace old beacon system with a LED medium intensity rotating beacon
- Replace electrical service with new cable and required grounding.
- Disassemble and remove existing beacon tower, includes disconnecting existing electrical power.
- Installation of new gates at airport entrance to provide security to the new beacon and beacon tower.

DBE Program and Goal Calculation – FAA requires airports to have a current DBE program if they receive \$250,000 or more in AIP funding during a Federal fiscal year. Each DBE program is valid for 3 years. This will include update of the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program and preparation of DBE goal calculation as required by 49 CFR Part 26. This will be included in the engineering scope under the proposed grant.

#### 2. **RESULTS OR BENEFITS EXPECTED**

The new beacon tower is needed to modernize the existing facilities which may be over 50-years old and which requires extensive maintenance. The condition of the existing tower makes maintaining the beacon difficult. Expensive beacon maintenance provides only temporary solutions and would be eliminated with the new beacon tower. The new beacon and beacon tower will improve safety of operations at the airport. The new gates will provide security and protection to the new beacon and beacon tower.

## 3. **APPROACH**

Plan of Action - All airport design will conform to Advisory Circular 150/5300-13B, Airport

Page 2

Design. Specifications will be prepared based on Advisory Circular 150/5370-10H, Standards for Specifying Construction of Airports. All safety requirements as outlined in Advisory Circular 150/5370-2G, Operational Safety on Airports During Construction will be included in the Construction Safety and Phasing Plan prepared for this project.

The engineering will be performed as follows:

**Project Formulation - DBE Program and Goal Calculation - The scope of work** for the DBE Program and Goal Calculation includes the following:

- ✓ Program Document Preparation according to required guidelines
- ✓ Print, Package and Mail
- ✓ Sponsor Coordination/Explanation of duties and requirements
- ✓ Program Maintenance
- ✓ Program Implementation and Support

#### Engineering Design Services During Construction and Project Closeout

- 2) Provide engineering surveillance of all construction operations, including attendance at weekly construction meetings, preparation of any change orders required, preparation of contractor pay estimates, preparation of FAA reimbursement requests, review of all contractor submittals, preparation of final as-constructed drawings and final engineer's report.

**Construction Management** - The Contractor will be required to furnish material submittals for all materials proposed for use on the project, provide all Quality Control Testing and Inspection during the construction of this project, and meet all requirements



The County of El Dorado proposes to perform the construction of the New Beacon Tower and Beacon at Georgetown Airport, Georgetown, El Dorado County, California, under the 2025 Airport Improvement Program of the Federal Aviation Administration. It is proposed to utilize the services of Brandley Engineering to perform engineering during construction and construction management of this project. The County of El Dorado and Brandley Engineering entered into negotiations for the engineering fees related to this project.

The consulting firm of Brandley Engineering was selected on October 12, 2021, from those consultants who submitted their qualifications for engineering services. A scope of work and detailed independent cost estimate in the amount of \$112,000 for the engineering during construction and construction management services were prepared by the Sponsor on April 23 2025, and submitted to the ADO by April 28, 2025.

The consultant submitted their fee proposal for the work on April 10, 2025, in the amount of \$121,000. The Sponsor's Independent Fee Estimate was \$112,000, which is within 92.6% of the consultant's fee proposal. Since the IFE was within 10% of the consultant's fee proposal, the Sponsor considers this reasonable and recommends accepting the consultant's fee of \$121,000.

The final fee proposal is considered reasonable by the Sponsor. A contract is currently being prepared for the agreement between the Sponsor and consultant. The draft contract, scope of work and consultant's fee proposal (Exhibit A), and Sponsor's independent cost estimate are attached to this record of negotiation and hereby submitted to the ADO for a reasonableness of cost determination.

The analysis was conducted in good faith to ensure the fees are fair and reasonable. The procedures outlined in AC 150/5100-14 have been followed.






Georgetown Airport El Dorado County Gate Replacement

The contractor shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the contract covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations.
- 3. <u>Solicitations for Subcontracts, Including Procurements of Materials and Equipment.</u> In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the contractor of the contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
- 4. <u>Information and Reports.</u> The contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Sponsor or the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders, and instructions.
