



Proclamation
OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO
Recognizing the Month of May, 2014, as
National Bike Month

WHEREAS, *for more than a century, the bicycle has been an important part of the working and recreational lives of Americans; and,*

WHEREAS, *today, millions of Americans engage in bicycling as a viable and environmentally-sound form of transportation that effectively improves air quality, reduces traffic congestion and noise, and contributes to the conservation of energy and also serves as an excellent form of healthy, fun, and affordable family recreational activity; and,*

WHEREAS, *in El Dorado County, from El Dorado Hills to South Lake Tahoe, a growing population of recreational and commuter cyclists are actively involved in shaping county, city, regional and national transportation policies by working toward the expansion of bike lanes, trails and cycling incentives; and,*

WHEREAS, *by engaging in bicycling as an alternative form of transportation, the environmental impacts of the automobile are minimized thereby preserving the natural treasures of El Dorado County and improving the quality of life for residents and visitors; and,*

WHEREAS, *the month of May is also regarded as “National Bike Month”, “Million Mile May”, “Clean Air Month” and “Bike to Work Day” is slated for May 15, 2014, in support and celebration of cycling as a fun and effective way to improve ourselves and our world.*

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, *that the Board of Supervisors for the County of El Dorado does herewith proclaim May, 2014, to be **NATIONAL BIKE MONTH** and encourages county and city residents to join them on the **GREAT BIKE RIDE** on Tuesday, May 13, 2014, from 12:00 to 1:30 p.m. on the Forni to Missouri Flat section of the El Dorado Trail.*
