**Proclamation**  
**Of the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors**  
**Recognizing the Georgetown Divide**

**Whereas**, America's Promise – The Alliance for Youth grew out of the Presidents' Summit for America's Future in 1997, and at that gathering in Philadelphia, Presidents Clinton, Bush, Carter and Ford, with Nancy Reagan representing President Reagan, challenged America to make children and youth a national priority; and

**Whereas**, the Presidents affirmed our special obligation as Americans (reaffirmed in 2001 by President George W. Bush) to keep **Five essential Promises** to young people, providing; caring adults, safe places, a healthy start, effective education, opportunities to help others; and

**Whereas**, since 1997, America's Promise has grown to become a dynamic, results-oriented alliance of organizations that represent all strands from the rich fabric of American life: corporations, nonprofits, higher education and faith-based groups, associations and federal agencies, and community groups, with each of the Alliance partners having a significant commitment to fulfill one or more of the **Five Promises**; and

**Whereas**, together these partners are improving outcomes for young people, locally, at the state level and nationally, resulting in the Alliance for Youth's annual competition to identify the "**100 Best Communities for Young People**" that recognizes "*Outstanding, Innovative Efforts That Benefit Children and Youth*"; and

**Whereas**, America's Promise – Alliance for Youth has awarded the **Georgetown Divide** one of the "**100 Best Communities for Youth, 2007**".

**Now therefore be it proclaimed** that the Board of Supervisors commends the commitment of dedicated community leaders, hardworking employees in the schools, agencies, and organizations on the Divide and in the region; committed parents and families and support of businesses and government; and the powerful young people who work alongside adults to improve our communities, resulting in this prestigious award.

In this time of opportunity — at the dawn of a new century and a new millennium — the need for shared responsibility is self-evident.



Our obligation, distinct and unmistakable, is to assure that all young Americans have


*Caring adults in their lives, as parents, mentors, tutors, coaches*

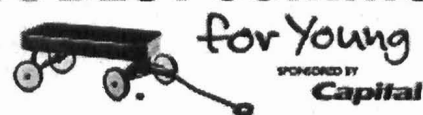
