These early experiences shaped my understanding of equity and ignited a lifelong commitment to creating change.

At the age of nine, I began volunteering, and it quickly became clear to me that the cycles of hardship many families face often begin long before a child enters school. I saw how essential it is to start at the very beginning—at birth—with intentional support, care, and advocacy. That realization has guided me through every step of my journey.

From my time at the Santa Cruz Children's Museum of Discovery, where I championed STEAM engagement and empathy-driven learning for young children, to my role as a Certified Peer Advocate with Monarch Services, where I supported individuals experiencing domestic violence and trauma, I've been committed to uplifting others in meaningful ways. Whether creating self-care strategies for frontline staff or answering crisis calls, I've approached every role with compassion and accountability.

As the owner of Little Chicklets Childcare in El Dorado County, l've worked directly with families to not only provide care, but to connect them with resources, meet them where they are, and help build strong foundations for their children's growth. My continued training in trauma-informed care and social-emotional development reinforces my belief that supporting the whole child—and family—requires listening, learning, and acting from a place of deep understanding.

Through programs like the FamNet Leadership Academy, the Community Input Series, and Leadership El Dorado Class 16, I've gained tools for civic engagement, collaboration, and systems-level thinking. I've also become deeply involved in the work of building a stronger community alongside organizations such as EDCOE, Catalyst Community, and Active 20-30.

I want to bring these lived experiences and developed skills into the role of community representative—to be a voice for those who are not always heard, to advocate for change where it is most needed, and to help break the very cycles I saw as a child. I'm committed to showing up with empathy, accountability, and action—for families, for children, and for the future of our communities
