Creation of Grant

Caldor Fire Relief Distribution TIMELINE:

- August 17: Application created for West Slope (Placerville to Kyburz)
- August 20: First Distribution for first 140 recipients
- August 27: Application for West Slope Closed
- August 29: Mandatory Evac Order for Tahoe
- August 30: Opened application for East Slope (Kyburz to South Lake Tahoe)
- Sept. 4: Application for East Slope Closed
- October 1: Last of over 20 distributions for all recipients

With the evacuation orders that came down from El Dorado County officials on August 17, 2021, El Dorado Community Foundation jumped to create an application to provide relief for EDC permanent and primary residents forced to leave their homes. Within 24 hours, we had the application available, and within days had tutorials set up to help folks complete the application. Roughly, 10 days later, an updated application was created for the East Slope as Tahoe went into mandatory evacuations. Applications were open for folks to apply between two weeks on the west slope and only 5 days for the east slope. We closed the applications once based on the funding available (funds donated to the Caldor Fire Relief Fund). Roughly 5,300 applications were received in total, and almost 4,900 approved.

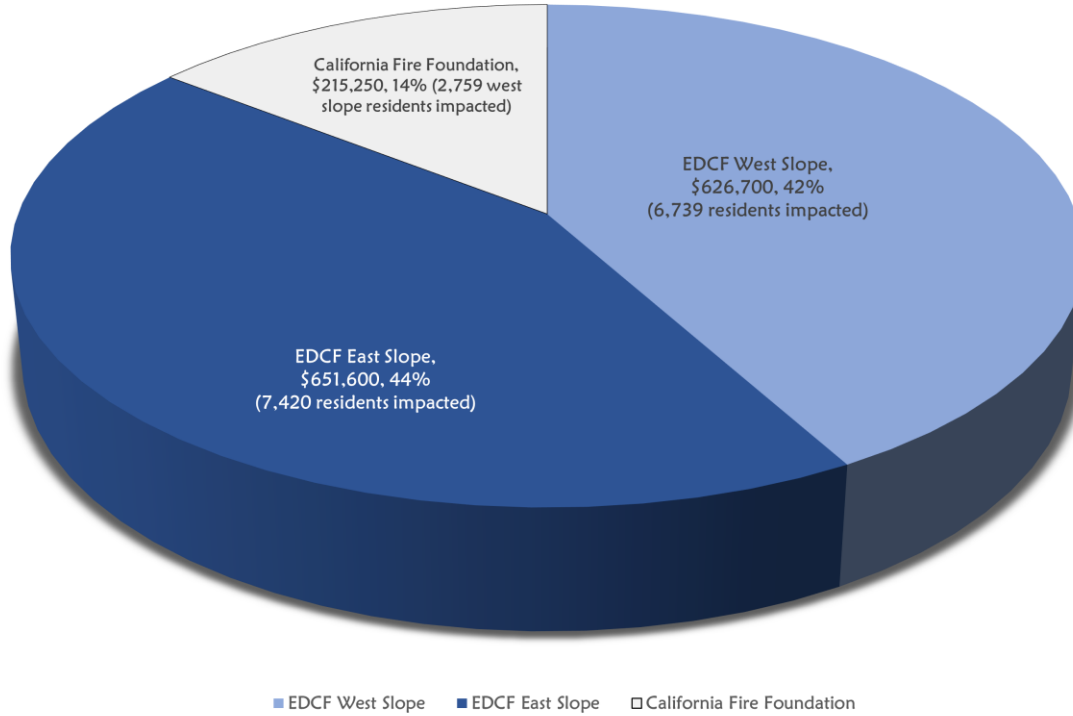

Applications were downloaded and combined on a spreadsheet. Ultimately 2,700 applications for the West Slope & 3,000 for the East Slope were compared to ensure funds went to each household **ONLY ONCE**.

M

Each address was placed into the EDC Sheriff's evacuation MAP to ensure the address was actually in the mandatory evacuation area.

P

Names, addresses, and emails were cross checked to ensure the people were actually **PRIMARY** and **PERMANENT** residents.

E

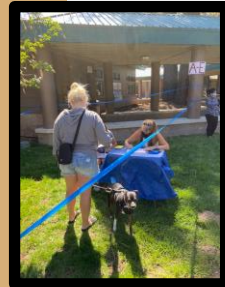
Thousands of **EMAILS** and phone calls were sent and answered to verify information and notify recipients of the multitude of distribution days and times.

DISTRIBUTION PROCESS



30+ Total Distributions on the EAST SLOPE

- 9 large-scale distributions in the parking lot of South Tahoe Middle School
22 Volunteers Overall
905 people received funds on the first distribution date
- 4 days at Cowork Tahoe for individual appointments
- 17 Ad-hoc appointments



26+ Total Distributions on the WEST SLOPE

- 10 large-scale distributions in the Courtyard (the line stretched to the Bell Tower)
33 Volunteers Overall
425 people received funds in two hours at Folsom Lake College
- 4 days in the newly remodeled Suite 105 for individual appointments
- 12 Ad-hoc Trips down the stairs to meet individuals in their cars
