El Dorado County Youth Commission Youth Survey 2014-2015

The El Dorado County Youth Commission (YC) hosted a Macaroni and Cheese Social with the El Dorado County Office of Education (EDCOE) and the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors (BOS) this year. During this event the YC had the opportunity to share their ideas, concerns and goals; as well as EDCOE and BOS discuss their programs for youth and ideas for the future.

The topic of attracting our youth to stay in El Dorado County; attracting youth to return after educational and career paths were established; and bring in new young residents and families was discussed. The BOS suggested that the YC run a survey to get feedback from our county youth.

The YC was very interested in the survey and decided to ask the high school seniors in the county for their responses. The high schools participating were: Oak Ridge; Union Mine; Charter University Prep; El Dorado; Golden Sierra; and South Lake Tahoe (their surveys have not been accessible online so their results are not part of the enclosed results). 561 Seniors participated.

Following are the results of the data collected. Most of the graphs represent the answers of all of the seniors combined. The YC found that the majority of seniors from the county high schools shared common goals, concerns and interests.


As most seniors are anxious to put their mark on the world and explore new environments, leaving El Dorado County is an understandable answer for most young adults. Their answers, and whether or not they would come back, are interesting as their reflect the reality, or perception, of the county through their eyes, and perhaps the limited experiences that they participated in.

An insight as to their activities, and what they enjoy doing in the county, is significant as these may be the very things that one day will be more important to them as they finalize their schooling, develop career paths, and look for a place to settle down. El Dorado County may be the very place that they would like to be.






Responses from 20 Charter University Prep High School seniors



Responses from 106 Union Mine High School seniors




Reponses from 209 El Dorado High School seniors














Responses from 200 El Dorado High School Seniors




Responses from 81 Golden Sierra High School seniors












How many extracurricular activities did you participate in throughout your childhood? Question 6
