- **4. Consistency with Local Plans** The project is reasonably consistent with plans existing at the time of submission of this application) of public agencies that are authorized by the State in which the project is located to plan for the development of the area surrounding the airport.
- **5. Consideration of Local Interest** It has given fair consideration to the interest of communities in or near where the project may be located.
- **6. Consultation with Users** In making a decision to undertake an airport development project under Title 49, United States Code, it has consulted with airport users that will potentially be affected by the project (§ 47105(a)(2)).
- 7. PART IV PROGRAM NARRATIVE

1. **OBJECTIVES**

An Application for Federal Aviation Administration Airport Improvement Program funds has been prepared for the engineering design of the Installation of a New Airport Beacon and Tower proposed to be included in the 2025 Airport Improvement Program at the Placerville Airport, Placerville, El Dorado County, California. The project description is as follows:

A new beacon is needed to update the existing facility to make the beacon more efficient and reduce maintenance. The new tip-down tower will allow safer beacon light replacement and maintenance. This project will include the new beacon and 55-foot-tall tip-down tower on a new concrete foundation, new pull box and duct near the new tower location, new cable in existing duct, and electrical upgrades in the existing electrical vault.

DBE Program and Goal Calculation – FAA requires airports to have a current DBE program if they receive \$250,000 or more in AIP funding during a Federal fiscal year. Each DBE program is valid for 3 years. This will include update of the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program and preparation of DBE goal calculation as required by 49 CFR Part 26. This will be included in the engineering scope under the proposed grant.

2. **RESULTS OR BENEFITS EXPECTED**

The new beacon tower is needed to modernize the existing facilities and which requires extensive maintenance. The condition of the existing tower makes maintaining the beacon difficult. Expensive beacon maintenance provides only temporary solutions and would be eliminated with the new beacon and tower. The new beacon and beacon tower will improve safety of operations at the airport.

3. **APPROACH**

<u>Plan of Action</u> - All airport design will conform to Advisory Circular 150/5300-13B, Airport Design. Specifications will be prepared based on Advisory Circular 150/5370-10H, Standards for Specifying Construction of Airports. All safety requirements as outlined in Advisory Circular 150/5370-2G, Operational Safety on Airports During Construction will be included in the Construction Safety and Phasing Plan prepared for this project.



The consulting firm of Brandley Engineering was selected from those consultants who submitted their qualifications, and the County of El Dorado entered into an agreement with Brandley Engineering.

The County of El Dorado proposes to install a New Airport Beacon and Tower at the Placerville Airport. Brandley Engineering presented a proposal for providing engineering design services for this project, which includes DBE Program and Goal Preparation, environmental studies, a pen and ink ALP update, geotechnical studies, engineering design and preparation of plans, specifications, and reports, and engineering services during bidding and award of the project.

The County currently has a contract with Brandley Engineering for the engineering design of the New Airport Beacon and Tower at Georgetown Airport, which has a similar scope of work to the Placerville Airport New Airport Beacon and Tower project. The only difference is that the Placerville Airport project includes preparation of the DBE Program and Goal Preparation for FY25-27 and full structural engineering design of the beacon tower foundation. I have compared the Georgetown beacon project design cost of \$63,500 with the addition of my estimate of \$13,200 for the DBE Program and Goal Preparation and \$5,280 for the structural engineering design of the beacon tower foundation to the proposed costs for the Placerville beacon. The cost difference is \$18,480 to a total design cost of \$81,980, which is 3.1% above Brandley Engineering's estimate of \$79,500.

Based on this evaluation, I hereby confirm Brandley Engineering's estimate for engineering design services for this project of \$79,500 is reasonable. This fee includes direct labor work hours, labor rates, general and administrative overhead, non-salary expenses, and a reasonable profit.


