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Why map Community Assessments?



Stakeholders

A meeting was convened with stakeholders who report on children and youth in the County in August 2019.

- Early Care and Education Planning Council
- EDC Child Abuse Prevention Council
- Head Start Community Assessment
- Mental Health Services Act
- Maternal, Child Adolescent Health

Objective

To engage communities by Supervisorial District to better understand their needs and the effectiveness of current services on an annual basis.

What did we learn?



Quantitative Data

Annually update data elements that align with all partners assessments and lives in WellDorado.

- The population is not limited to 0-24.
- We can add elements to ensure the adult and senior populations are reflected.
- The ability to report data in smaller, meaningful geographic regions is optimal.
- Although zip code data is smaller, it lacks community context. Census track data is smaller, but should be reported in a larger context such as Supervisorial Districts.
- Both zip code and census level data is not widely available.
- The EDC Surveyor has mapped census tracks to Supervisorial Districts.

Qualitative Data

Annual community engagement that may include focus groups, key informants and/or survey tools, recorded in WellDorado.

- Host events in each Supervisorial District.
- Community partners could attend between 3-5 PM and community members from 6-8 PM. A dinner would be served
- Child care could be available on site.
- We would need a large site that would allow for break out rooms for smaller groups.
- We could collaborate with the local faith community to train volunteers to facilitate breakout sessions to reduce bias, build sustainability and promote the events.

Qualitative Data

Annual community engagement that may include focus groups, key informants and/or survey tools, recorded in WellDorado.

- Our leadership team would need to have training in the facilitation method .
- Surveys could be used every three years, consistent with the census's annual community survey.
- Surveys could be built upon the health accreditation, MHSA and Strategic Plan templates.
