Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS)

► The County participates in the Drug Medi-Cal organized delivery system. The DMC-ODS is a managed care model of service delivery for SUDS similar to the County Specialty Mental Health services model. County has been under contract with the State to provide Medi-Cal beneficiaries Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services through the DMC-ODS since June 1, 2019.

A triage assessment is completed and based upon indications a referral and appointment linkage is completed for outpatient services or an appointment is made for a full assessment for authorization to a residential level of care.

County SUDS staff work with the client throughout their treatment episode in accordance with the indicated level of need.

Recovery Services are available for those who need support once treatment is completed or need extra support during their treatment episode.

- Perinatal Services serve women who have a substance use disorder and are either:
 - Pregnant
 - Postpartum with children
 - Have dependent children
 - Attempting to regain custody of their children
 - > Have a substance exposed infant
- Priority admission is given in the following order:
 - Pregnant injection drug users
 - Pregnant substance users
 - Injection drug users
 - All others

County Prevention Programs

Prevention uses a County Strategic Prevention Plan (SPP) as the framework for local SUD youth prevention activities:

- A five-year plan. County is currently in year four of the current plan.
- Requires state approval.
- Based on county and local assessments, data and trends.
- Target strategies are focused on the prevention of marijuana and alcohol use among our youth.

County Youth SUD Prevention Activities

Peer Council

Peer Council

- Serves high-risk youth at risk for entering into the juvenile justice system. The goal is to empower youth to positively change their lives by addressing poor choices and anti-social behaviors in a peer-supported environment.
- Prevention staff recruit and train youth volunteers to provide the peer support. Peers are trained in Adverse Childhood Experiences, Active Listening, Risk and Resilience factors, Leadership skills, as well as signs and symptoms of anxiety, depression and substance use disorders.

County Youth SUD Prevention Activities

Botvin Life Skills Training

Prevention staff facilitate school classroom training to middle school students using an evidenced based curriculum designed to help students learn and apply personal selfmanagement skills, general social skills and drug resistance skills.

Friday Night Live/Club Live

Supports youth to be free of alcohol, tobacco and other drug use through education and asset building. Youth have the opportunity to gain important leadership skills and create positive change in their community.

- ▶ SUDS staff works closely with community agency partners to ensure:
 - Access to care barriers are identified and reduced.
 - Services provided are coordinated and not duplicated.
 - SUDS input regarding community initiatives related to SUD treatment.
