PURPOSE OF THE COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Committee is to review and make recommendations to Staff, Zoning Administrator, Planning Commission, and the Board of Supervisors regarding the following in the Area of Responsibility:

- **All development projects within the Diamond Springs El Dorado Community Region.**
- **General Plan updates pertaining to the area of responsibility.**
- **Project adherence to the Missouri Flat Design Guidelines, Diamond Springs Historical Overlay, and/or Board of Supervisors approved Design Standards.**
- **Other issues as directed by the Board of Supervisors.**

WHAT WE DO

We provide an opportunity for members of the Diamond Springs and El Dorado communities and stakeholders to have an early review of proposed projects and afford an opportunity for them to provide input and express concerns. We have worked with the Planning Department to develop the Missouri Flat Design Guidelines and the Historic Design Guide and worked with the County to establish a historic zoning overlay in Diamond Springs and El Dorado. This action takes the form of a letter to the County Planner for inclusion in a staff report.

PROJECT REVIEW

Significant projects that have come to this committee for review:

- Diamond Springs Parkway
- Diamond Springs Community Park
- Dorado Oaks 374-unit residential subdivision in eastern Diamond Springs
- Instrumental in implementing state Rule 20A which requires utilities to be placed underground in the downtown Diamond Springs area during any future Capital road project.
