Veteran Dependents: College Tuition Fee Waiver

- Waives tuition and specified fees at any state funded (public) school
 - Community Colleges, CSU, and UC eligible to apply through your doctorate
- Four categories of eligibility
- Student must be a resident as defined by learning institution
- Provides California veterans with over 35 million dollars per year
- Does not cover books, parking, or dorm/meal fees

WE WANT TO SAY YES! The CalVet Veteran Home Loan Program has been saying YES to veterans in California since 1921. We've been lending to veterans for over 100 years! Our team's primary mission is to help you say YES to home ownership.

I was in the service over 25 years ago. Can I apply for a CalVet loan?

YES, all veterans who served on active duty can apply. Any age, any state of enlistment.

Is it easy to apply for a CalVet pre-approval?

YES, apply online by visiting the CalVet Home Loans website at www.calvet.ca.gov/homeloans to start the streamline pre-approval process. After you have submitted an application online, a CalVet representative will contact you and guide you through the process.

I want to use my VA loan benefit. Should I consider a CalVet Home Loan?

YES, CalVet is able to combine your federal loan benefit with benefits offered by the state of California to create home financing that is an excellent value for our veterans.

I used the CalVet program once before. Can I use it again? YES, you can use CalVet home loans again and again. If you had a CalVet home loan in the past and it has been paid in full, you may apply for another loan.

What if I want to build a home? Can CalVet help?

YES, we offer construction loans as well as other specialty loans such as rehabilitation purchase loans and home improvement loans.

I hear CalVet has an excellent property insurance program for most of its loans?

YES, CalVet offers outstanding fire and hazard insurance coverage along with disaster coverage including earthquake and flood protection.

My credit score is too low for my bank to help. Can CalVet work with me?

YES, all loans are manually underwritten to maximize flexibility and improve home ownership opportunities for all veterans. Although we have credit standards, we do not have a minimum credit score requirement.

If I had a short sale, foreclosure, or bankruptcy in the past can I get a CalVet loan?

YES, CalVet loans are manually underwritten; thus, we often are able to help veterans obtain a CalVet VA loan after a short sale.

California is a richly diverse state with an equally diverse veteran population. Of the 1.6 million veterans in California, 754,831 self-identify as an ethnic minority. While minority veterans comprise approximately 47% of the total California veteran population, as a group, they are less likely to access their veterans benefits than non-minority veterans.
