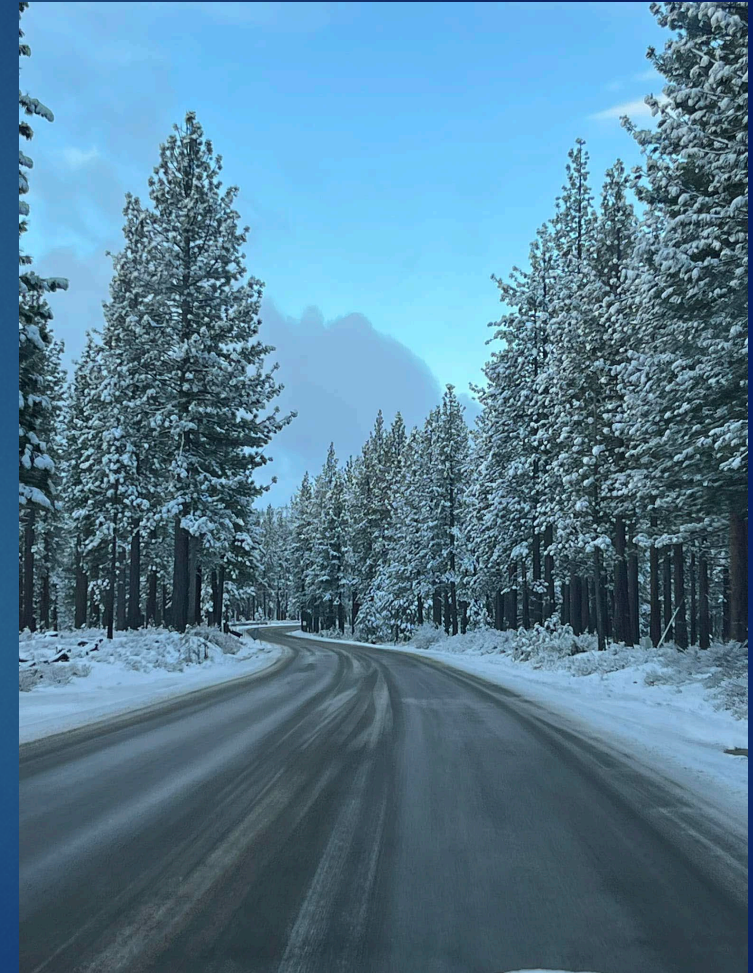


Snow Removal Update

Snow Removal in the Basin

- ▶ For Transportation to run full snow removal shifts, 12 staff members are needed for a SLT day shift, 11 staff members for a SLT night shift and 3 staff members for Tahoma.
- ▶ In South Lake Tahoe there are 18 full time Highway Maintenance Worker allocations. Of those 18 positions, 3 are sent to Tahoma, leaving 15 positions in South Lake Tahoe. Therefore, there is a staffing shortage of 8 positions.
- ▶ Extra Help Snow Removal Workers are utilized to aid permanent staff and ensure Transportation has enough staff for both shifts.
- ▶ Each year Transportation has up to 10 snow removal extra help positions allocated. However, all 10 have not been filled in over a decade.
- ▶ Transportation's goal is to plow each road within 24 – 48 hours, depending on staffing levels, availability of equipment and location.



Winter 2024-25

- ▶ Transportation ended the winter with 6 extra help Snow Removal Workers. Extra help positions ended April 4, 2025 and are funded by Road Fund.
- ▶ Extra help Snow Removal positions received an additional cash incentive of \$230.77 per pay period worked.
- ▶ Four (4) 966 rental loaders were utilized throughout the winter. The rental program was funded by \$250k DTOT.
- ▶ Transportation owns the snow blower and plow attachments for the rental loaders.
- ▶ Equipment did not experience any catastrophic failures like in previous years. However, 3 of the 4 mountain blowers are from the 1970's.

Looking Forward...

- ▶ Transportation will start recruiting for extra help in June/July with a desired start date the first week of November.
- ▶ Staff will secure snow rental houses for Tahoma and South Lake Tahoe prior to September. Looking at a larger rental in SLT due to low staffing success in the Tahoe Basin.
- ▶ One mountain blower on order has a current ETA prior to October to replace one of the 1970's blowers. (Measure S funded)
- ▶ Review the no parking ordinance prior to Winter 2025-26



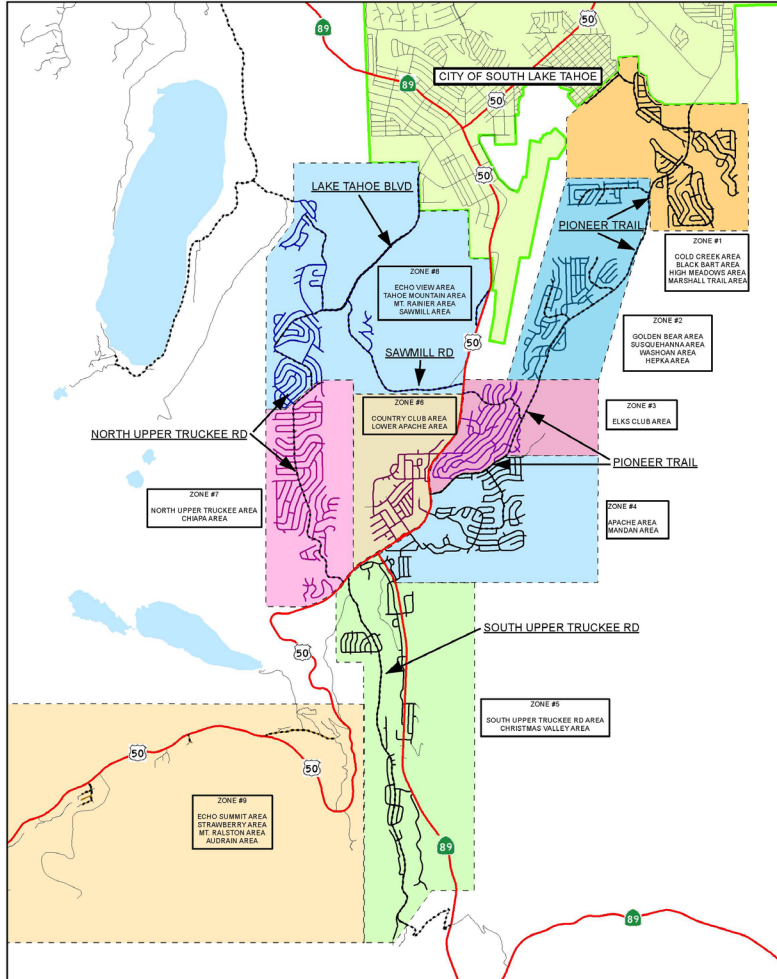
Fiscal Year 2025-26

Proposed Budget Items



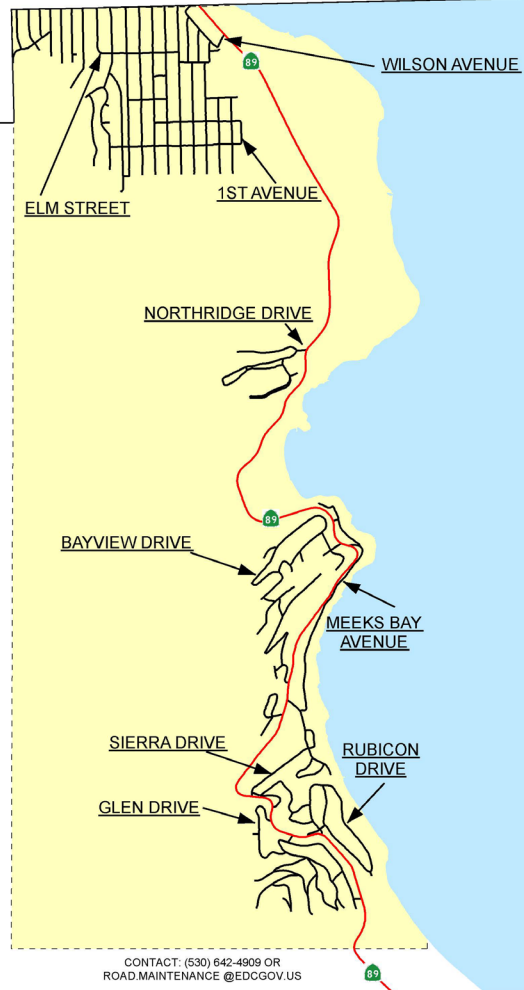
- ▶ 1 additional mountain blower is on order and should be received in 2026 (Measure S funded).
- ▶ 2 replacement graders with plows and gates (Measure S funded).
- ▶ \$250k for loader rental program (GF).
- ▶ 2 replacement sanders and 2 replacement plows for a total of \$250k (GF).
- ▶ \$337,000 budgeted for extra help Snow Removal Workers (RF).
- ▶ \$481,000 budgeted for sand, salt, hauling of sand and salt, rental houses in SLT and Tahoma, snow stakes, beet juice, chains, cutting edges and plow guards (RF).
