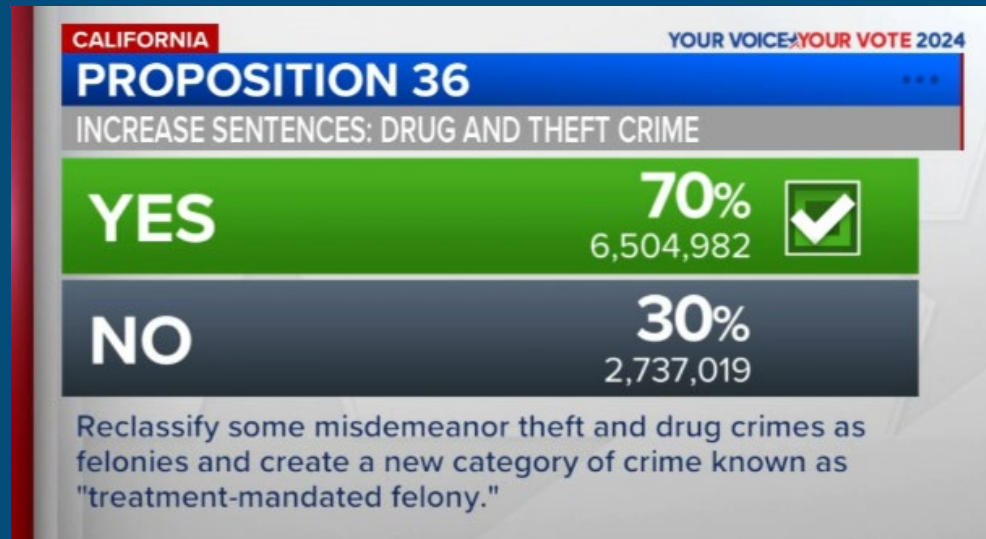
Tough on crime

Defendant: You thought I was joking? Like I told you it's not a joke here. If this was Sac county I would be done in a year or a half. You know, this is not Sac county.

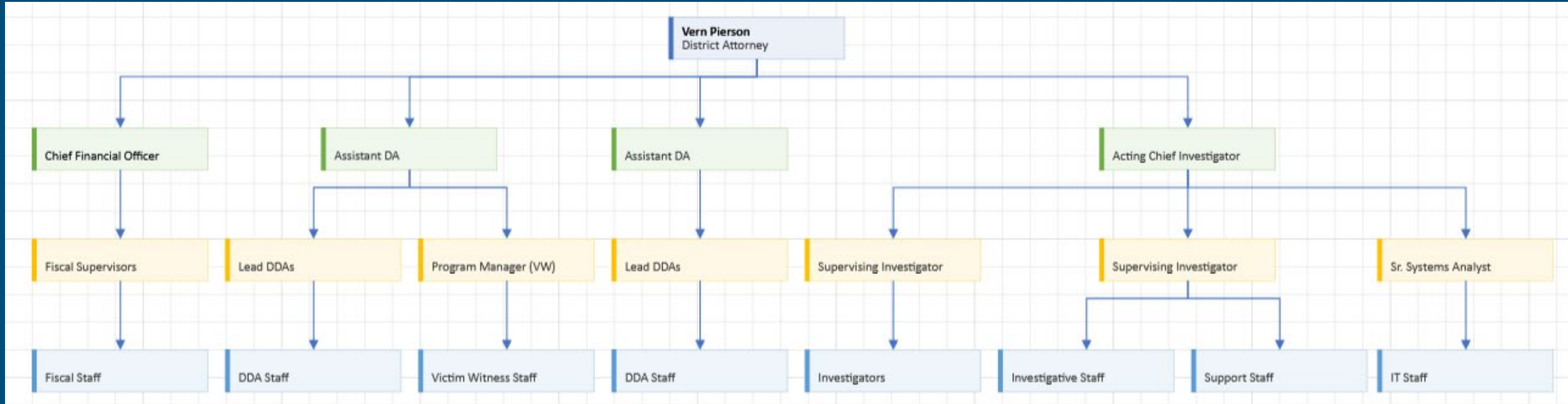

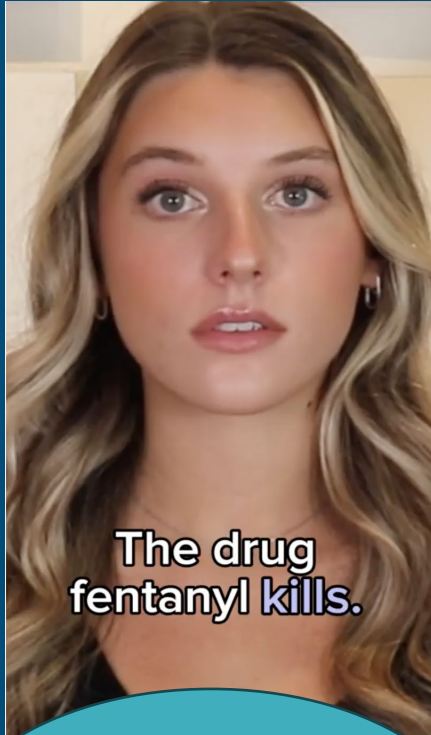

- EDCDA, along with EDCOE, has worked diligently to establish a tiered, county-wide threat assessment team.
- The team partners with multiple agencies, including county mental health, probation, CPS, EDSO, PPD, and SLTPD.
- As threats to our community are identified, the team gathers to assess the threat and implement a multidisciplinary plan to minimize the threat.
- Since implementation, the Level Two team has assessed and derived plans of action in approximately 23 threat cases.
- We have also trained the Level One teams at our local schools.
- EDCDA is currently expanding the team to address threats of targeted acts of violence in our county, not just at the school level.

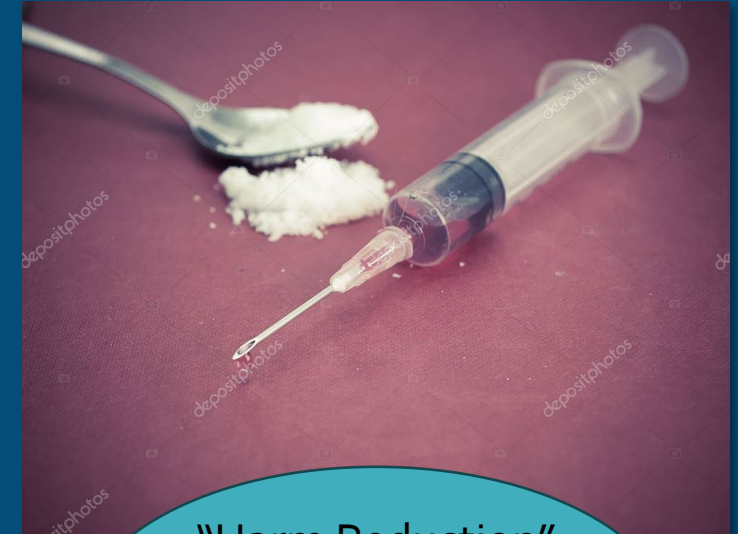

- Continuous collaboration among EDSO, Placerville PD, SLT PD, CPS, BEAR Clinic, Washoe County CAC, California DOJ Crime Lab, HOPE Counseling Center, Live Violence Free, the Center, and the EDC District Attorney's Office
- On track to complete more than 125 forensic interviews of child victims and witnesses in 2024
- Over 30 children have received trauma-informed therapy services through our partner agency, HOPE Counseling Center, in 2024

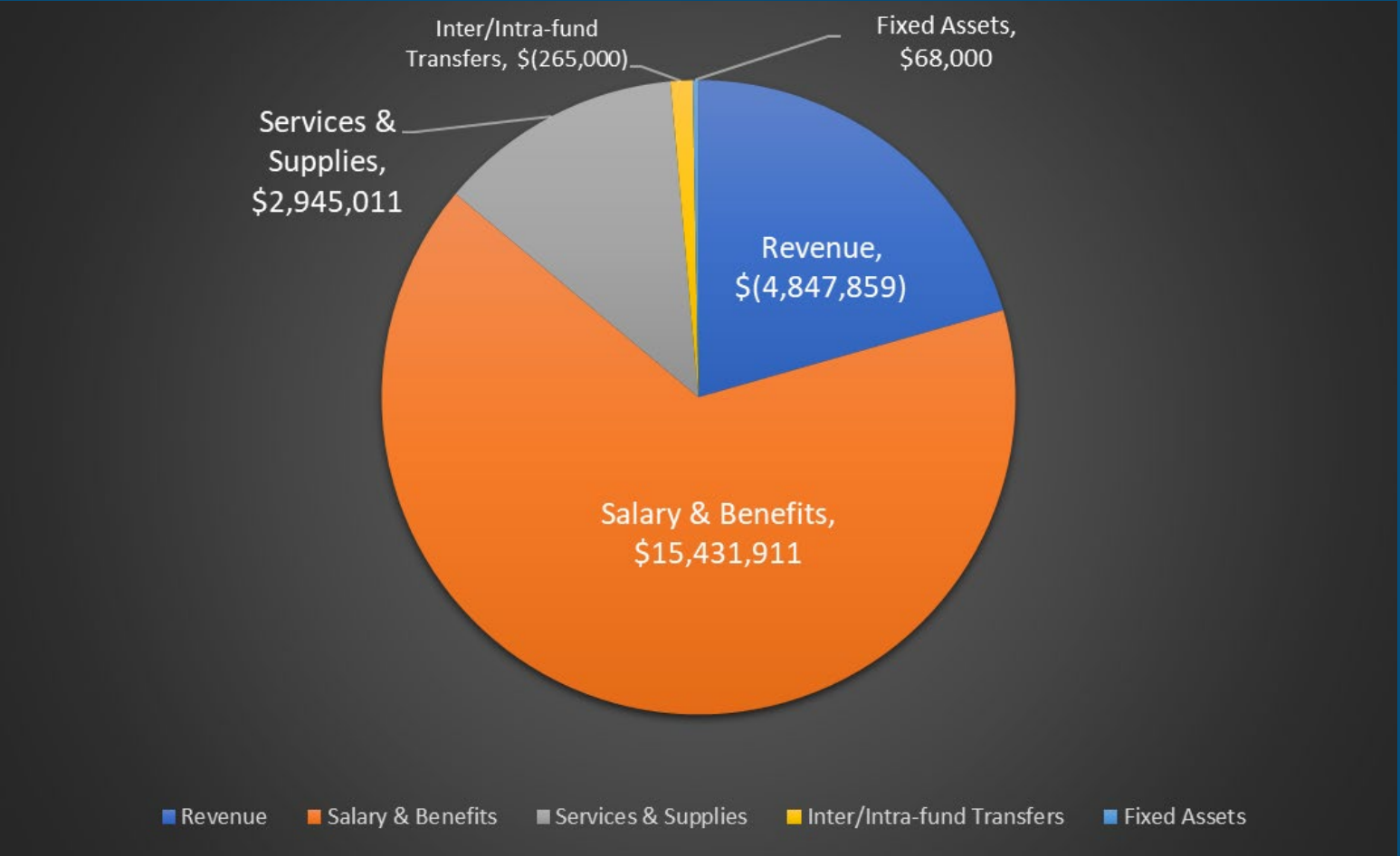

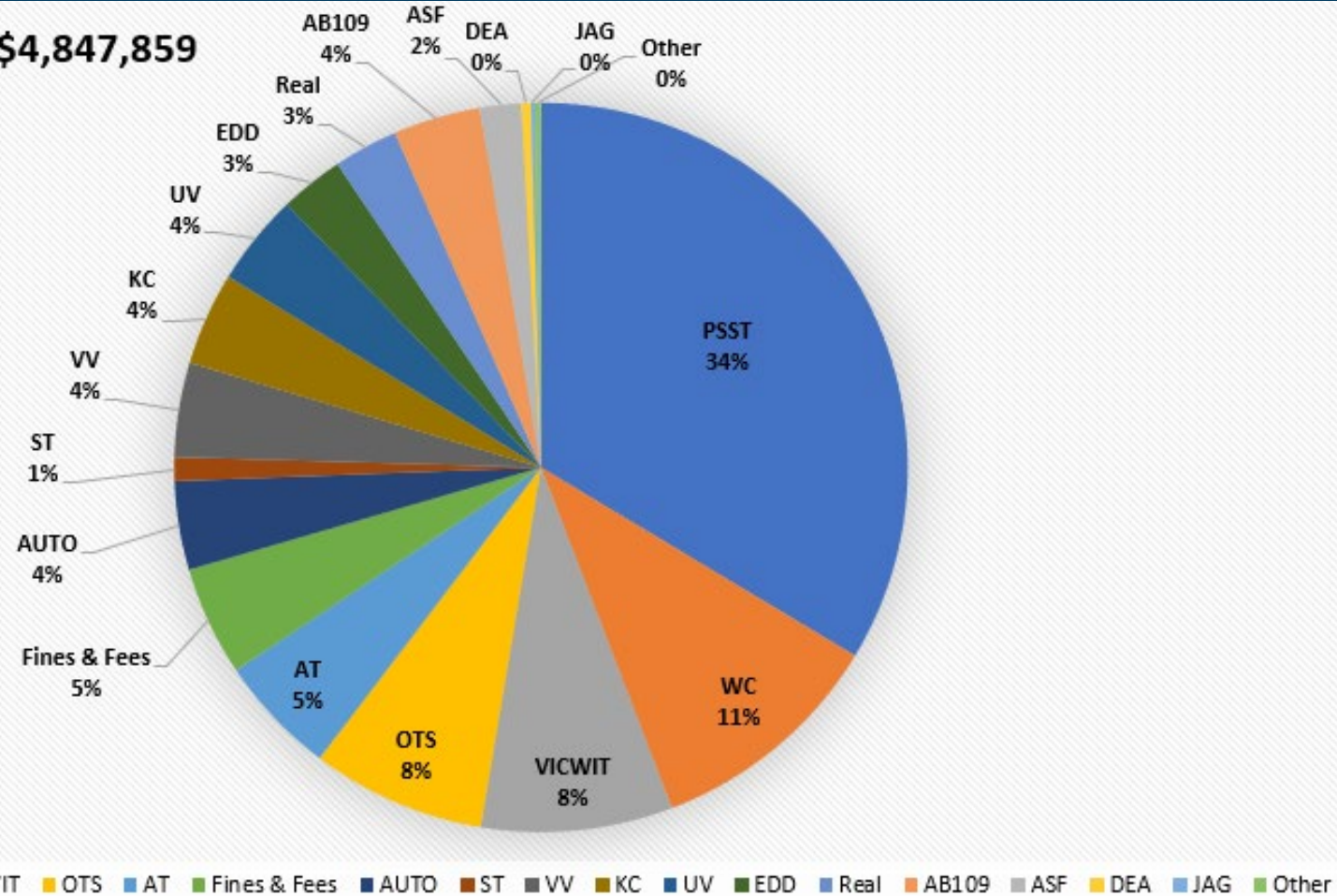

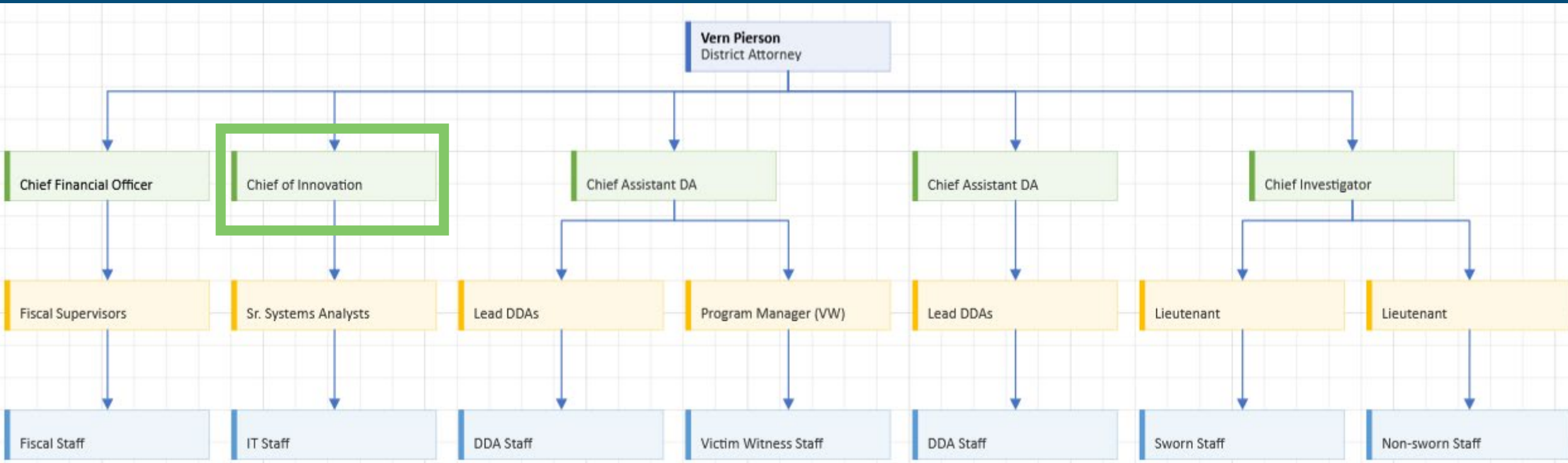


Always Seeking Justice and Innovation
