FUNDING: Marshall Foundation for Community Health Grant

Background: The purpose of the Marshall Foundation for Community Health Grant is to fund educational and health promotional activities in Areas of Focus, such as Coronary Heart Disease or Cancer and to contribute needed healthcare resources to the community. The Health Promotions Division of the Public Health Department has selected Coronary Heart Disease as its Area of Focus for the Marshall Foundation for Community Health Grant. Health Promotions will partner with Marshall Medical Health Promotions and local middle schools to provide the BodyWorks program, an effort to prevent obesity; promote healthy eating habits and lifestyles; modify sedentary behaviors; provide training through Train the Trainers program; and involve parents, children, medical providers and local communities. It is expected that the BodyWorks program will be integrated into the aforementioned partners ongoing service delivery systems.

Reason for Recommendation: This Grant will help to further the Department's mission to promote healthy communities throughout El Dorado County.

Fiscal Impact/Change to Net County Cost: If the grant application is successful, El Dorado County will receive up to \$4,000 in funding over a one-year period. There is no net County cost. The grant does not require any matching funds from the County.

Action to be taken following Board approval: Department to submit Application for Grant; Public Health Director to execute any resulting Agreement and sign any other documentation to administer the Program for the duration of the Grant's one-year period; Department to work with Purchasing Agent to execute sub contracts with other County agencies and school districts.
