Recommendations:

The Department of Transportation (DOT) recommends the Board accept this final report and terminate the authority granted on January 10, 2006 for the DOT to proceed under Public Contract Code Sections 20395, 22035, and 22050 to dispense with competitive bidding requirements to immediately secure assistance from outside contractors and consultants to perform the necessary emergency repairs pursuant to written contracts signed by the Chairman of the Board.

Reason for Recommendation:

As a result of a series of rain storms that occurred at the end of 2005 and beginning of 2006, severe damage occurred to many County roads. A State of Emergency was declared for the County of El Dorado by Governor Schwarzenegger on January 3, 2006. The Board further ratified resolutions declaing the emergency at its Special Board Meerting of January 5, 2006. A Federal declaration of a State of Emergency followed.

The extent of the damage at three locations, Mosquito Road, Church Mine Road, and Consumnes Mine Road was so severe that the use of general contractors was necessary to immediately stabalize and repair the sites. On January 10, 2006, the Board authorized the Department of Transportation to proceed under Public Contract Code Sections 20395, 22035, and 22050 to dispense with competitive bidding requirements to immediately secure assistance from outside contractors and consultants to perform the necessary emergency repairs pursuant to written contracts signed by the Chairman of the Board.

The Department, with the approval of the Board Chair for various contracts, has proceeded with the work and repairs have been completed at all three locations. Utilization of the emergency contract provisions of the Public Contract Code is no longer needed. Approval of the staff recommendation will terminate the emergency authority granted on January 10, 2006.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no direct fiscal impact associated with the termination of the emergency contract provisions.

The costs associated with these three projects are estimated as follows:

Given the Federal and State declarations of a State of Emergency, the DOT is in the process of submitting reimbursement requests to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the State Office of Emergency Services for eligible costs. Under the emergency declarations, staff continues to be hopeful FEMA will reimbursement 75% of actual costs, and OES will reimburse 25% of actual costs, subject to limitations in overhead and administration.

Since both agencies operate on a reimbursement only basis, and do not guarantee full reimbursement, the cost associated with these projects is currently being paid by the road fund.

Invoicing to OES, for both FEMA and OES funds is ongoing. To date the County has received \$958,468 in reimbursements for DOT related emergency repairs Countywide. An accounting of all emergency related costs is underway and will be reported as part of the mid-year budget projections.

Net County Cost:

There is no cost to the General Fund at this time. Should reimbursements from FEMA and OES be substantially less than anticipated, a contribution from the General Fund may need to be considered to reduce impacts to road fund programs.
