The Rubicon Trail is considered the crown jewel of off-highway driving. The Rubicon has been used since the 1890's as a road and has been a motorized road since 1908.

This was a very important project because of the large amounts of people who visit the trail each year, many not knowing how long the trail is or where they are located.
