- Chief Administrative Office recommending the Board ratify the Chief Administrator's signature on Facility Use Agreement No. 430-O1111, agreement between the County of El Dorado and Pacific Gas and Electric Company for use of the Veterans Memorial Building beginning on February 4, 2011 through March 3, 2011 for the sole purpose of operating an Emergency Staging Area for their workers. Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall pay County a minimum of \$2400 for the first four days and shall have the option of use for the remaining three days at \$600 per day.
