- 20% of families have members under the age of 18.


## Demographics

- In 2009, children made up 24% of the population of the United States
- An estimated 160,00 children worldwide are diagnosed with cancer each year and 90,000 will eventually die from their illness.
- □ 15-18% of children in U.S. live with a severe chronic health condition

Few services exist for seriously ill children in our community.

Limited resources available aimed at support and counseling for children experiencing serious illness in their families.
