#### **Project Description:**

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) proposes to provide parking and shuttle services for the El Dorado County Fair in 2022 and 2023. With funding, parking and shuttle services will be provided beginning thirty (30) minutes before opening and ending thirty (30) minutes after closing on all four days of the County Fair's operations. The shuttle will be free to the public and will provide round-trip service from two (2) parking locations; the Library/Government Center on Ray Lawyer Drive, and the Ray Lawyer Drive Park & Ride on Forni Road. Shuttle buses will board and disembark Fair passengers at the Main Gate of the County Fairgrounds located on Placerville Drive. One (1) to five (5) transit vehicles will be in simultaneous service during the Fair's hours of operation, according to demand. El Dorado Transit will provide all operators, support vehicles, relief vehicles, and support personnel necessary for shuttle operations.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSIT AUTHORITY TO SUBMIT A PROPOSAL FOR ASSEMBLY BILL 2766 (AB 2766) MOTOR VEHICLE EMISSION REDUCTION PROJECTS

**WHEREAS**, the California Clean Air Act requires local air pollution control districts to reduce emissions from motor vehicles; and

**WHEREAS,** AB 2766, codified in California Health and Safety Code section 44223, authorizes districts to impose a fee of up to four dollars upon certain registered motor vehicles within the district, and the Governing Board of the El Dorado County Air Quality Management District (EDC AQMD) has imposed said fee; and

**WHEREAS,** said legislation requires the EDC AQMD to use said funds for activities related to reducing air pollution from motor vehicles and for related planning, monitoring, enforcement, and technical studies necessary for the implementation of the California Clean Air Act of 1988; and

WHEREAS, El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) is an eligible applicant for AB 2766 projects; and

WHEREAS, the EDC AQMD has published a request for proposals for AB 2766 funding; and

WHEREAS, El Dorado Transit will prepare grant applications for projects;

**BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED,** that the Executive Director of the El Dorado County Transit Authority is hereby authorized and directed to submit proposals for Assembly Bill 2766, Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Projects, and to execute all necessary actions to carry out the purpose of this resolution;

## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

#### Objectives

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) proposes to provide parking and shuttle services for the El Dorado County Fair in 2022 and 2023. The El Dorado County Fair Shuttle will reduce congestion, lower emissions related to excessive idling and provide a safe comfortable alternative to parking in and around the Fairgrounds. By providing the option of convenient off-site parking and shuttle service, pedestrian traffic along Placerville Drive will also be reduced and public safety improved.

#### Scope of Work

With funding, parking and shuttle services will be provided beginning thirty (30) minutes before opening and ending thirty (30) minutes after closing on all four days of the County Fair's operations. The shuttle will be free to the public and will provide round-trip service from two (2) parking locations; the Library/Government Center on Ray Lawyer Drive, and the Ray Lawyer Drive Park & Ride on Forni Road. Shuttle buses will board and disembark passengers at the Main Gate of the County Fairgrounds located on Placerville Drive. One (1) to five (5) transit vehicles will be in simultaneous service during the Fair's hours of operation, according to demand. El Dorado Transit will provide all operators, support vehicles, relief vehicles, and support personnel necessary for shuttle operations.

El Dorado Transit proposes to provide the following with grant funding:

- A base of approximately 150 hours of passenger service, and up to 225 hours of service depending on demand, with up to five (5) transit buses with seating capacity for thirty-two (32) passengers each
- Support staff including transit operators, operations supervisors, transit dispatchers, equipment mechanics and project managers will be available and/or on-site for the duration of the event
- Support vehicles and relief vehicles
- Outreach and regional marketing; including website notifications, announcements, press releases and advertisements in local newspapers
- Shuttle and parking signage; signage shall range in size from 8.5"x11" to 36"x48"
- Liaison with County and/or private facilities management for off-site parking
- Public liability insurance coverage
- Associated contract administration costs
- Flyers in shuttle buses including acknowledgement of Air Quality Management District (AQMD) funding to be placed in safe reasonable locations within the vehicles.
- Coordination with partner agencies and local law enforcement

The El Dorado County Fair Association is committed to providing a twenty-percent (20%) match with a combination of dollars and in-kind resources, as follows:

- Outreach and regional marketing; including website production and maintenance, announcements and advertisements in local newspapers
- Support staff for coordination and support of shuttle operations
- Matching funds totaling at least twenty percent (20%) of the project budget

## **PROJECT ORGANIZATION/BACKGROUND**

#### **Project Organization**

El Dorado Transit will administer the El Dorado County Air Quality Management District (AQMD) contract for the 2022 and 2023 County Fair Shuttles. With funding, El Dorado Transit will manage off-site parking agreements and provide public liability insurance, vehicle maintenance and support, shuttle vehicles, operators and appropriate support staff to ensure public safety. El Dorado Transit will provide AQMD with periodic performance reports, as required, to ensure the project is on schedule and within parameters.

#### Background

El Dorado Transit has provided public transportation services for the Western Slope of El Dorado County since 1975. Established as a Joint Powers Agency with the County of El Dorado and the City of Placerville, El Dorado Transit provides public transportation for the community in the form of local fixed routes; curb-to-curb Dial-A-Ride; Sac-Med non-emergency medical transportation; ADA Complementary Paratransit; commuter routes between El Dorado County and downtown Sacramento and between Sacramento and South Lake Tahoe; and contracted transportation for social service agencies. El Dorado Transit provided a combined 376,284 passenger trips during Fiscal Year (FY) 2018/19, which was the most recent full year before the COVID-19 pandemic.

More than fifty (50) employees provide transportation services fifteen (15) hours a day Monday through Friday, and nine (9) hours per day on weekends. All components necessary to provide public transportation are housed within the Transit Operations and Maintenance Facility at 6565 Commerce Way, Diamond Springs, California 95619. El Dorado Transit maintains and schedules a fleet of sixty (60) vehicles, including wheelchair accessible mini-vans; lift-equipped buses with capacity ranging from twenty (20) up to fifty-seven (57) passengers, two (2) mobile mechanics' trucks and eight (8) staff vehicles. In-house services include operations; dispatching and scheduling; trip planning; vehicle maintenance; transit planning; marketing and full administrative support.

El Dorado Transit management, operators and staff have a distinguished level of commitment and competence in providing efficient public transportation to the residents of the Western Slope of El Dorado County. Management and supervisory employees have completed the accredited Paratransit and Transit Management Program.

El Dorado Transit is an experienced shuttle operator. The agency has provided annual shuttle service for the El Dorado County Fair since 1990. The County Fair Shuttle project provides an average of approximately 12,000 passenger trips per year, averaging about 3,000 boardings per day.

The El Dorado County Fair Association will make a monetary contribution to the cost of the shuttle in the amount of at least \$5,500 in 2022 and \$5,500 in 2023.

The El Dorado County Fair Association will develop, produce and distribute print advertising, promotional materials, email promotions, and maintain websites for marketing and outreach valued at a minimum of \$2,300. In addition, El Dorado Transit will develop and produce shuttle signage to promote the Fair Shuttle.

## **MONITORING PROGRAM**

El Dorado Transit proposes to provide parking shuttle service for the El Dorado County Fair in June 2022 and 2023. The El Dorado County Fair Shuttle will reduce congestion; lower emissions related to excessive idling and provide a safe comfortable alternative to parking in and around the Fairgrounds. The shuttle will provide a regional mitigation to traffic congestion and pedestrian traffic on Placerville Drive.

AB 2766 grants are performance based. For the El Dorado County Fair Shuttle, ridership will be the primary performance measure as it relates to the cost effectiveness of the project as a whole. Being a cooperative, customer service project; planning, preparation, collaboration and marketing are all vital to the success of the project. These activities must take place well in advance, during and after June 2022 and June 2023 when the shuttles are scheduled to run. Ridership will be tracked by the transit operators while shuttles are in service utilizing standard trip sheets. Trip sheets include names, service times, vehicle numbers, miles traveled and passenger boardings. A sample trip sheet is provided in Appendix A. All shuttle trip sheets will be collected at shift end, compiled and verified by the on-duty dispatcher or supervisor. Upon completion of shuttle operations, ridership and mileage data will be consolidated into a single Operations Report and provided to AQMD, as required. An example Operations Report is provided in Appendix A.

Accurately judging the cost effectiveness of the El Dorado County Fair Shuttle requires close monitoring of expenditures, tracking of project related activities and timely, detailed cost accounting. As a public transportation provider under a joint powers agreement with the County of El Dorado and City of Placerville, El Dorado Transit has extensive experience in reporting such performance measures and accounting to Federal, State and local government agencies as well as internally to its publicly elected Board of Directors. El Dorado Transit has sufficient staff to operate, market, manage, track and report on the performance of the El Dorado County Fair Shuttle. The Planning and Marketing Manager (PMM) will act as Project Manager and Agency Liaison for the shuttle. The PMM will be responsible for working with internal staff in the Operations, Maintenance and Accounting departments and with partner organizations and contractors to track project activities and expenditures. Documentation of all project related activities and expenditures will be maintained on file and made available for review to the AQMD, El Dorado County Auditor, California Air Resources Board, Bureau of State Audits, or their designated representatives for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment, unless otherwise required. Documentation may include but is not limited to the following: copies of project timecards, account listings, bank records, work orders, employee timecards, trip sheets, invoices, promotional materials and advertising, certificates of insurance, meeting agendas, signin sheets, and notes. El Dorado Transit will grant designated representatives access to such records during regular business hours at its offices, 6565 Commerce Way, Diamond Springs, CA 95619.

El Dorado Transit will provide AQMD with regular performance reports, as required, until project billing is completed. This will ensure the project is on schedule and within parameters. Reports may include but are not limited to; transaction details, account listings, project timecards, invoices and operations reports.


