








Data Requests: Trip Types











Data Requests: Trip Origin



- Washoe: road maintenance, RTC

- Focus transit on visitors & commuters
- No free parking
- Free transit serves park-and-ride lots
- Funding: sales, property, hotel taxes, & service contracts
- Major employers fund transit

Local Funding

Expenditure Plan

- Identify specific projects & benefits
- Articulate project phasing
- Deliver (some) projects immediately

Governance & Administration

- Increased TRPA/TTD alignment
- Implementing agency options
