Please reject the request from Blue Mountain Communities to exempt themselves from the Conditions of Approval (COA) #25, 27 and 28,

I live off of Deer Valley Road and have to deal with the horrible traffic while turning onto Green Valley. There needs to be a signal there and the COA for Summer Brook was supposed to provide that. I was in the room in 2008 when the BOS approved this project and Ron Briggs was very adamant that there needed to be traffic mitigation as part of the approval. This project has already watered down the COAs over time... narrowing roads, removing gutters and removing the sound wall. It is time to say "enough" and make the developer abide by the COAs!

Blue Mountain was aware of the COAs when they purchased the project. Saving that the applicant has "reassessed condition" is like saying the prisoner has "reassessed his sentence"! Of course, neither of them like the condition but they do not get to change it. Only the BOS and Planning Commission can change it and I am begging both of you to hold firm on this COA and not allow it to be removed. Please require the signal at Deer Valley Road.

Over the recent years many projects have been approved or started on the Green Valley corridor. Revere at Silver Springs and now Summer Brook will both add traffic, as will the newly approved Grocery Outlet that is a mile away from this project. If the County does not require the COA to be met it will follow the pattern that we see all too often... infrastructure is needed but the County is broke and does not have the funds to complete it. If only there were a way to fund these safety improvements... well here is a case where we can fund it! Enforce the COA! Say "No" to Blue Mountain Community and require them to install the signal.
