However, many of our youth in El Dorado County still struggle with their families when they come out, and there is still a higher percentage of homelessness and suicides amoung LGBTQIA+ youth than their straight peers.

It is hard for me to believe that anyone's God is against honoring all efforts that provide opportunities for a life free from discrimination and prejudice and in support of equality and the pursuit of happiness
