

## Recognizing Virginia Huber for 37 Years of Service for the County of El Dorado

WHEREAS, Virginia Huber joined the El Dorado County Environmental Management Department as a Sanitarian II on May 1, 1973, and her distinguished career in service to her community resulted in numerous promotions over the years to Sanitarian III, Sanitarian IV, and Environmental Branch Manager; and,

WHEREAS, Virginia was one of the first 50 women to be registered in the environmental health profession in the State of California; and,

WHEREAS, Virginia has been instrumental in the preservation of South Lake Tahoe throughout several disasters such as the 2007 Angora Fire, and the aftermath of the 1985 winter storms which disrupted the natural gas supply to South Lake Tahoe and threatened to shut off water in the basin; and,

WHEREAS, Virginia was selected in 1994 as one of the County of El Dorado's outstanding employees of the year; and,

WHEREAS, Virginia has demonstrated the highest degree of professionalism and integrity during her tenure with the County of El Dorado.
