

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES #610-S0711 AMENDMENT I

This Amendment I to that Agreement for Services #610-S0711, made and entered into by and between the County of El Dorado, a political subdivision of the State of California (hereinafter referred to as "County") and Sierra Recovery Center, a California Corporation, duly qualified to conduct business in the State of California, whose principal place of business is 1137 Emerald Bay Road, South Lake Tahoe, CA 96150 (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor");

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Contractor has been engaged by County to provide substance abuse testing and treatment services, detoxification, residential treatment, intensive outpatient, outpatient groups, individual counseling, and transitional housing for clients referred by the Human Services Department, in accordance with Agreement for Services #610-S0711, dated June 13, 2007, incorporated herein and made by reference a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have mutually agreed to modify the scope of services, extend the term, and increase the compensation of said Agreement, hereby amending ARTICLE I – Scope of Services, ARTICLE II – Term, and ARTICLE III – Compensation for Services; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have mutually agreed to amend ARTICLE XII - Notice to Parties and ARTICLE XX - Administrator; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have mutually agreed to add ARTICLE XXV — Mandated Report Requirements, ARTICLE XXVI — Conflict of Interest ARTICLE XXVII — Medi-Cal Screening, ARTICLE XXVIII — Compliance with All Federal, State and Local Laws and Regulations, ARTICLE XXIX — Access to Records and ARTICLE XXX — County Business License.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties do hereby agree that Agreement for Services #610-S0711 shall be amended a first time as follows:

ARTICLE

Scope of Services: Contractor shall provide personnel and services necessary to furnish therapeutic counseling, client treatment plans and written reports, substance abuse testing and treatment, intensive outpatient treatment, outpatient groups, individual counseling sessions, detoxification, residential treatment, and transitional housing services as requested by County. Services shall include, but not be limited to, individual psychotherapeutic counseling to assist with chemical addiction and related social, psychological, and/or medical problems that impede the client's ability to meet the objectives of the client's treatment plan as approved in writing by the client's caseworker. Clients admitted to treatment may be tested for substance abuse usage. However, the cost of such testing shall be included within Contractor's rate for residential or transitional service and shall not be billed separately. All substance abuse testing shall be scheduled and conducted on a random basis to ensure accurate monitoring of client progress. Contractor shall immediately and verbally inform the appropriate caseworker, at no charge to County, of client appointment no-shows, cancellations, or any other urgent concerns directly affecting the client's treatment plan.

Whenever possible, individual counseling sessions shall be provided by a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) or Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT) licensed by the Board of Behavioral Sciences, or other certified parties, as appropriate. If service is delegated to an intern, the individual must be pre-licensed and all assignments must be under the direct supervision of licensed or certified staff. No intern shall be the sole author of any written treatment plan or report. All said documents must be reviewed, approved, and signed by a LCSW or MFT as described above. Substance abuse treatment shall be provided by Certified Addiction Specialists.

Services shall be provided during Contractor's normal business hours and days. After hour appointments, if necessary, must be approved beforehand in writing by the caseworker and their supervisor and billed at the normal business rate in accordance with ARTICLE III-Compensation for Services except for perinatal services, which are not included in this Agreement.

Transitional Living services for clients shall be provided in accordance with standards set forth in Exhibit "D" marked "SIERRA RECOVERY TRANSITIONAL HOUSE HANDBOOK" attached and incorporated herein and made by reference a part hereof.

Prior to the commencement of work for any contracted service(s), Contractor shall obtain a written authorization form that has been signed by the Program Manager, Director, Assistant Director, and/or Chief Financial Officer.

A written proposal shall be submitted to and approved by the Human Services Director, Assistant Director, and/or Chief Financial Officer prior to the commencement of any work for any services requested but not specified within "Scope of Services" and/or having specific pricing in either "Compensation for Services", and/or the attached Exhibit "C".

Services shall not be started without one of the above signed authorizations. A copy of all written authorizations must be included with any invoices submitted for payment. Failure to do so could delay payment. The County shall not pay for any services that have not been preapproved in writing, "no shows", cancellations, telephone calls, or for the preparation of initial

assessments or bimonthly client progress reports as more fully detailed as follows:

<u>Initial Assessment</u> -Within twenty-one calendar (21) days of the client's initial visit, Contractor shall provide the caseworker, at no charge to County, with a written initial assessment and treatment plan, indicating the type of therapy to be utilized and recommended number/frequency of sessions. Once services have been approved and initiated, Contractor shall secure prior written approval from the appropriate caseworker, their Supervisor, and Program Manager before making any changes to the authorized treatment plan, including type of therapy and number/frequency of sessions.

Bimonthly Client Progress Reports - No later than (30) days after the end of each second service month, Contractor shall provide the caseworker, at no charge to the County, with a brief written progress report outlining the primary issues being addressed with each client, their progress, and ongoing treatment goals (see Revised Exhibit "B", marked "Bimonthly Client Progress Report," incorporated herein and made by reference apart hereof). If an alternate progress report is used, all fields noted on Revised Exhibit "B" are mandatory. Failure to provide said progress report may delay payment for other preauthorized services as said report is included as a required deliverable.

<u>Court Documents</u> – Upon request and within the time limit specified by County, Contractor shall provide the caseworker, at the DMC individual counseling session rate of 50 minutes per session and with a two (2) hour maximum per report limit, comprehensive written reports for County's use in court. Please note that the written initial assessment and treatment plan are excluded from the court documents reimbursement rate as payment for the initial assessment and treatment plan are addressed under "Initial Assessment", above.

<u>Court Appearances and/or Multidisciplinary Team Meetings</u> - Upon subpoena by County, Contractor shall attend court sessions. Upon request by County, Contractor shall attend multidisciplinary team meetings. Contractor shall be paid for these appearances at the individual counseling session (50 minutes) rate for time actually spent in the courthouse or in the meeting. The County shall only pay Contractor for court appearances when County subpoenas Contractor.

Reports detailed herein are considered a required deliverable. Services shall be considered incomplete until such date as said reports are submitted to and approved by the Department of Human Services. Compensation for services shall not be provided for incomplete services.

Reports and authorizations shall be attached to invoices.

ARTICLE II

Term: The term of this agreement as amended shall be for the period of May 24, 2007 through June 30, 2010.

ARTICLE III

Compensation for Services: For services provided herein, County agrees to pay Contractor monthly in arrears. Contractor shall submit monthly invoices no later than fifteen (15) days following the end of a "service month". For billing purposes, a "service month" shall be defined as a calendar month during which Contractor provides services in accordance with "Scope of Services". Failure to submit invoices by the 15th of the month following the end of a service month may result in a significant delay in payment. Invoices submitted for payment by the 15th of the month following the end of a service month shall be paid within thirty (30) days following County receipt and authorization of approved invoice(s). An example of an approved invoice containing necessary and pertinent billing information is described in Revised Exhibit "A" marked "Invoice," incorporated herein and made by reference a part hereof.

Compensation for services provided from May 24, 2007 through December 31, 2007 shall be in accordance with ARTICLE III of the original contract.

For services provided after December 31, 2007 the maximum billing rate¹ shall be at the current State-approved Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) reimbursement rates, described in Exhibit "C" marked "Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) Reimbursement Rate Schedule Effective January 1, 2008, El Dorado County Departments of Human Services and Public Health, Substance Abuse and Other Therapeutic Counseling and Treatment Services" except for the following rates:

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Maximum Billing Rate Detail: A) If it is determined the client has private insurance that covers the service(s), Contractor shall bill the appropriate insurance carrier first as primary insurance carrier. If the client's insurance covers the service at a rate less than the rate set forth in this Agreement, Contractor shall only bill the County for the difference. If the client has no insurance for the service, Contractor shall bill the County at the rate set forth in this Agreement. B) For individual therapy sessions, Contractor shall submit a single monthly invoice for each individual, noting the dates of service, the name of each individual treated, the type of treatment (individual therapy), the number of hours of service for each date, and the rate. C) For family therapy sessions, Contractor shall submit a single monthly invoice for each family, noting the dates of service, the names of the family members treated, the type of treatment (family therapy), the number of hours of service for each date, and the rate. Billing shall be at the set hourly rate for the family unit, not per person. D) For group therapy sessions, Contractor shall submit a separate, single monthly invoice for each group therapy participant for whom the County has requested service, noting the date(s) of service, the name of the individual treated, the type of treatment (group therapy), the number of hours of service for each date, and the rate.

The County shall not pay for "no shows", cancellations, telephone calls, or preparation of initial assessments or bimonthly client progress reports. Contractor shall immediately and verbally inform the caseworker, at no charge to County, of client appointment no-shows, cancellations, or any other urgent concerns directly affecting the client's treatment plan.

Contractor shall bill County using the attached sample invoice, or a similar invoice, containing the same necessary and pertinent billing information. Contractor shall submit only original invoices and a copy of the written authorization(s) for service with all invoices submitted and bimonthly reports as applicable for payment. Photocopied or faxed invoices shall not be accepted. Contractor shall ensure only billing information is included on the invoice. Information related to clients' diagnosis, prognosis, or treatment is not permitted on the invoice. Invoices are to be sent accordingly:

The total of this Agreement, as amended, shall not exceed \$75,000.00 for the stated term.

ARTICLE XII

Notice to Parties: All notices to be given by the parties hereto shall be in writing and served by depositing same in the United States Post Office, postage prepaid and return receipt requested. Notices to County shall be addressed as follows:

ARTICLE XX

Administrator: The County Officer or employee with responsibility for administering this Agreement is DeAnn Osborn, Staff Services Analyst, Human Services Department, or successor.

ARTICLE XXV

Mandated Reporter Requirements: Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with mandated reporter requirements pursuant to the provisions of Article 2.5 (commencing with Section 11164) of Chapter 2 of Title 1 of Part 4 of the California Penal Code, also known as The Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act.

ARTICLE XXVI

Conflict of Interest: Contractor attests that it has no current business or financial relationship with any County employee(s) that would constitute a conflict of interest with provision of services under this contract and shall not enter into any such business or financial relationship with any such employee(s) during the term of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XXVII

Medi-Cal Screening: Contractor shall screen 100% of referred clients for Medi-Cal eligibility. The screening shall include, but not be limited, to:

- 1. Verifying that the Medi-Cal beneficiary is eligible to receive Medi-Cal services at the time the client is referred for service; and
- 2. Verifying El Dorado County as the responsible County; and
- 3. Assessing for valid full scope aid codes; and
- 4. Monthly verification of client eligibility during the time the services are provided to the client.

ARTICLE XXVIII

Compliance with All Federal, State and Local Laws and Regulations: Contractor shall comply with all Federal, State and local laws including, but not limited to, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 (42USC12101 et. seq.) and California Government Code Sections 11135-11139.5, and all regulations, requirements, and directives pertinent to its operations. Contractor shall abide by manuals, directives and other guidance issued by the State of California. All appropriate manuals and updates shall be available for review or reference by Contractor from the County Department of Human Services.

Contractor shall further comply with all applicable laws relating to wages and hours of employment and occupational safety and to fire, safety and health and sanitation regulations. Such laws shall include, but not be limited to, the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act, the Davis-Bacon Act, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, the Clean Air Act and amendments, the Clean Water Act and amendments, and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.

Contractor further warrants that it has all necessary licenses, permits, notices, approvals, certificates, waivers and exemptions necessary for the provision of services hereunder and required by the laws and regulations of the United States, the State of California, the County of El Dorado, and all other appropriate governmental agencies and shall maintain these throughout the term of the Agreement.

· ARTICLE XXIX

Access to Records: The Contractor shall provide access to the Federal, State or local Contractor agency, the Controller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized Federal, State or local representatives to any books, documents, papers, and records of the Contractor which are directly pertinent to this specific Agreement for the purpose of making an audit, examination, excerpts, and transcriptions.

ARTICLE XXX

County Business License: It is unlawful for any person to furnish supplies or services, or transact any kind of business in the unincorporated territory of El Dorado County without possessing a County business license unless exempt under County Code Section 5.08.070.

Except as herein amended, all other parts and sections of that Agreement #610-S0711 shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) Reimbursement Rate Schedule Effective January 1, 2008 El Dorado County Departments of Human Services and Public Health Substance Abuse and Other Therapeutic Counseling and Treatment Services

NOTE: Any changes to DMC rates by the State will become effective the first day of the month following the month that the State announces the approval of any change(s), i.e. formal adoption of the State budget. Services will be billable based on the specific types of services defined in each agreement. All rates may not apply within each individual agreement depending on type of service needed and/or available and criteria of funding source.

Outpatient Services

Group Session (1.5 hrs)

- 0 \$31.56
- A face-to-face session in which one or more therapists or counselors treat no less than three and no more than twelve clients at the same time, focusing on the needs of the individuals served.

Individual Counseling Session (50 minutes)

- 0 \$74.79
- O A face-to-face session between a client and a therapist or counselor.

Perinatal Group Session (1.5 hrs)

- \$63.62
- A face-to-face session in which one or more therapists or counselors treat no less than three and no more than twelve clients at the same time, focusing on the needs of the individuals served. Client must be pregnant and substance using; or parenting and substance using, with a child or children ages birth through 17 years. This includes a woman who is attempting to regain legal custody of her child (ren).
- Reimbursable only thru Perinatal Set-Aside and Perinatal Drug Medi-Cal funding

Perinatal Individual Session (50 minutes)

- 0 \$106.08
- O A face-to-face session between a client and a therapist or counselor. Client must be pregnant and substance using; or parenting and substance using, with a child or children ages birth through 17 years. This includes a woman who is attempting to regain legal custody of her child (ren).
- Reimbursable only thru Perinatal set-aside and Perinatal Drug Medi-Cal funding.

Day Care Rehabilitative

- o \$67.55
- Substance abuse counseling and rehabilitation services lasting three or more hours, but less than
 24 hours, per day, for three or more days per week.

Individual Assessment (50-60 minutes)

- 0 \$74.79
- The evaluation or analysis of the cause or nature of mental, emotional, psychological, behavioral, and substance abuse disorders; the diagnosis of drug abuse disorders; and the assessment of treatment needs to provide medically necessary treatment services.

Intake (50 minutes)

- o \$74.79
- The process of admitting a client into substance abuse treatment. Should include medical coverage evaluation, sliding fee scale determination, and other client demographic information.

REVISED EXHIBIT C

Treatment Planning (50 minutes)

- o \$74.79
- Collaborative session between program staff and client to identify problems, goals, action steps, and target dates as components of an individual's prescribed course of substance abuse treatment.

Discharge (50 minutes)

- 0 \$74.79
- Face-to-face final collaborative session between program staff and client to reinforce newly developed recovery skills and develop a plan to maintain those skills upon conclusion of treatment.

Crisis Intervention (50 minutes)

- 0 \$74.79
- o Face-to-face contact between a program staff person and a client in crisis. Services provided must focus on alleviating the crisis problem. Crisis means an unforeseen even or circumstance which presents an imminent threat of relapse, or actual relapse, to the client.

Case Management (50 minutes)

- Activities involved in the integrating and coordinating of all necessary services to ensure successful treatment and recovery. This involves managing multiple clients and is limited to 4 episodes per month. Not billable per client.

Transitional Housing (per day)

- A clean and sober living environment meeting the requirements of the California Association of Recovery Homes voluntary certification process. Clients in transitional housing shall be encouraged to actively seek permanent housing, work toward a high school diploma or GED if they do not posses one, and, if unemployed, begin an intensive job search within 72 hours of entering transitional housing.

Inpatient Services

Residential Treatment (per bed day)

- o Not to exceed \$92.00. The actual rate will be negotiated between the purchaser and the vendor.
- The delivery of services to males and females in an inpatient setting. Program should consist of group education and counseling, drug screening, individual counseling, treatment planning and introduction to support programs such as AA/NA.

· Residential Perinatal Treatment (per bed day)

- 0 \$96.81
- The delivery of services to females who are pregnant or who have children age 17 or under, including women who are attempting to regain legal custody of their child (ren). Program should consist of group education and counseling, drug screening, individual counseling, treatment planning and introduction to support programs such as AA/NA.

Residential Perinatal Drug Medi-Cal (room and board per bed day)

- o \$17.00
- Eligible clients must meet Title 22 Drug Medi-Cal requirements and program must be Drug Medi-Cal certified. Program should consist of group education and counseling, drug screening, individual counseling, treatment planning and introduction to support programs such as AA/NA.

Although continuing with program work, being responsible in your job and/or echooling and cutcide functions are a large part of continued growth in your personal recovery, they are only part of the process; equally important is maintaining a clean, soler and stable environment. This means perdespation in running a group home. There is no excuse for not doing your shore of housekeeping, coolding, maintenance or not being involved in the various house activides. Not to there any excuse for minding the Outpatient groups, individual breatment review escalomo, echeduled random urine testing, 12-step meetings and activities except when work, education, or appointments are pre-approved by your

Program Figs

Community Service:

For the Men's and Women's Transitional House, you are required a milhimum of eight (3) hours weekly. For the econom of the Women and Children Mouse, you are required a minimum of six (6) hours weekly. These hours and residued commitments will be expedified as tollows: Control the Licut Deep at Outputient for resignment of a minimum of four (4) hours westly and the Residential orgics for scalement of a reparation of four (4) points weekly. Morres at the Morres and Children House are required to schedule a minimum of ets (6) hours weekly , three of Outpetient and three of Residential.

Separation from Residential Cliente:

Once you have moved into the Transitional House you no longer are to Geograph of the contraction of t with residential elemb (made or female). It is important that they are focused on their prediment and that has sie terries on hom panelyon. Lon the encompares to po cordial, but you are not permitted to them or spend time with them, spend time or have any other inappropriate contest. You are not permitted to have any financial transactions or do chopping for them at all (this includes food, eigenstics and transportation). Chores:

All chores must be completed and ready for impection by 8:00 a.m. The house and grounds must be kept clean at all times. This includes play area, all parking areas, alds yards and living area.

Regu are to ps made glothes but axist by uncome most ps quesed mobbed or vacuumed, the bilehen counters wiped down, dishes deemed and put away, the belibroom factures elemed, and surfaces wiped down and kept this way. A chore schedule is posted in the kitchen. If you are unable to do your appointed chore because of a conflicting appointment, you must delegate to another house member.

Failure of each person to maintain the cleanliness of the transitional house will result In written warmings to the person(s) with the infraction. It should be noted that three (4) write-was for own intractions of own rules is cause for egovikion Grown the house.

Menlos

Each house member is responsible for purchasing, staring, and preparing his/her own meals. This is to include labeling food that is stored in community areas such as the refrigerator. Each member will be assigned her/his own individual cabinet and/or shelf space in the kitchen area. No food or beverages are allowed in the bedrooms. Under NO circumstance will any member take food of another resident without permission. This is considered steeling and the thicf will be expelled from the house.

III. Aktivdes and Behaviors

Prejudice and acting in an uncivil or aggressive manner towards one another, is not allowed.

Obscene or "low life" dress, (** Please see attached dress code for specific guidelines) actions, and speech are not allowed on or off the property. Street five, prison lingo, "Junky attitudes" and brassing about the good old days show a lack of decire to break away from the old way of life and will not be tolerated. Any threatening behavior, individuation, act of violence, vandalism, or words/ects of prejudics will be grounds for

You have all come here with the same goal. No member to better then another no . matter what rece, creed, color, sexual orientation or background.

Sterra Recovery Center Transitional Mousing will not allow anyone to remain who cannot leave his or her prejudices at the door. House members are expected to get to know each other and respect each other's views. 'Grouping up and excluding other members violates the unity of the house and will be tolerated.

Dating/Relationships:

While a member of the house no dating or sexual relationships are allowed. Indinate excual relationships between clients, staff and/or housemates is excitily forbidden. Violation of this rule will result in eviction. Staff has a code of ethics that forbid any outside friendships, commet or relationships of other than a professional nature with any current or past elient. Please konor this and do not act in a seductive or inviting manner towards them.

If you were in a relationship prior to moving into the house, Sterra Recovery Center ctaff will access these relationships on an individual basis and develop appropriate treatment planning that will determine what, if any level of involvement, will be allowed. You will be expected to adhere to any agreed treatment contract you make with no without exception.

III Groups and Meetings:

MEETING AND ITSIE CONSEQUESES CAN AND WILL INCLUDE MOVINGE

1. Outpation: Comesting:

Prior to moving into the house you must have an appointment for a treatment plan with an outpatient councilor. If for any reason you miss or try to delay this appointment, you will be asked to move immediately. It is a requirement for each resignat to pe emballed and an active bartreibant in companies on the spent chemical dependency treatment. Pailurs to comply will result in immediate dismissel.

2. Solf Help Meedings:

Sponsorship and fallowship support is encouraged. Everyone is required to attend a minimum of three (3) self-holp meetings per week and be working with their sponsor of a celf-holp advisor on a weekly basic. Times will be set-aside for you then the your opposer at the bouse. This will be determined at the weekly electing. (cono Transitional House Member May sponsor anyone will be living in our

1. Unscheduled House Mestings

Any house member can call a house meeting to deal with a problem at any time. Consideration should be given to those who work or study late when calling these

When a house meeting is called, the concerned member must follow simple procedure:

- Notify the House Supervisor
- Speak directly with the House member(s) causing the problem.
- Be respectful and focused.

4. House Business Meetings:

A business meeting will be held each week. The time and day will be decided based upon the schedules of the house members. It is mandetory for all members to attend. This meeting will be to discuss the following: Klowe Mahmenencs

- Chore Assignments
- Meeting Schedules
- Problems
- Mous Projects

IV. Telephone Policy:

No long distance calls or toll calls can be made on the House phone. Asyons found to be using a calling card or third party billing without permission of the owner or making calls billed to the House may be expelled from the Klouce.

If the phone beeks, while hon are on the line it means there is a call waiting. MOU MUST, answer the call. This is out of respect for the others in the house.

\mathbb{V}_{\circ} Medical

Any member receiving a prescription or needing to take medications while in the Transitional House, must fist set this approved by the Clinical Director PRIOR to filling or using the medication. Anyone using medications for a purpose other than prescribed or in quantities prescribed will be

It you develop a medical problem that comet be properly taken care of in the transition home, you may be asked to leave and referred to a modical facility.

If you cannot show proof of having had a TB test within the past twelve months, you must be tested within 30 days of entering Sterra Recovery Center Transitional Rouse or within 12 months of your last test.

You may not take comeons else's prescribed drugs. ("Please know this is a felony and no level of breaking the law is not tolerated by this program). They are only for the person for whom they have been prescribed. If you do abuse this you will be expelled from the house immediately. This will include the person for whom the drugs were prescribed for and the person who takes them without a doctor's prescription.

VI.: General

1. Clothing

Proper etdre must be worn at all times! Clean, appropriate clothing is to be worn at the house and sway. T-shirts must not have "drug/alcohol culture" logos. Be usindful of what you wear to ensure you are not repeating old behaviors. This could also include expasing too much of your body. Be careful, it could be very important as to how others see you. (""Pleace review atteched Dress Code)

2. Curiew

All residents are expected to be home by 9 p.m. Honday through Thurrday, and Pri, Sat and Swn by 11 p.m., unless worlding or visiting overnight with friends or family with the permission of your councelor. If for any reason you find that you counct return by the cabeduled time you must contact the Blowce Supervisor and the Residential office immediately.

J. Mouse Supervicor

The House Supervisor is respondible for the smooth running of Sterra Recovery Center Transitional Riouse. They are here not only to pay attention to the mismbers' needs and well-being but also to assist each member's growth and transition. They have been chosen because it was felt that they would exercise their authority with wisdom and apply the rules and regulations as the director intended them.

4. Heoloting

Members are here to prepare themselves for independent living. Part of this preparation is participation in a continued program, and learning to get on in a group environment. Members who are isolating in their rooms will be confronted and recvaluated for continuing in transitional living.

5. Kitchen

Each member will be given a chelf or supboard space for personal storage. There will be no borrowing of personal food, beverages or condiments without permission of the owner. The latchen will be cleaned after each meal or mack. This means dishes, utenalle, counter tops, stovetop, and dining table cleaned and dried, and everything put away. You must clean out your parties of the refrigurator AT LEAST once a week to throw out old food and for general cleaning.

6. Languago

We are trying to break our old habits and attitudes and many of us are in the habit of using words that may offend others. You must curb your use of this at all times in the house and out on the grounds. Any slang words used to describe race, creed, color, etc. will be grounds for expulsion from the house.

7. Sign in/Sign out

All members must sign out when leaving the House. All the requested information on the Sign In/Out Sheet must be completed if Imovn. When away from the house, members are to stay away from people who are known to drink or use, and name contar a place where alsohol is one of the principal products cold Chara, casinos (unless attending the maxica), mightaluba, etc.)

- Weapons of any kind. This does not include amail pocketimives.
- o Pornographic literature pictures and films. Including "women or men's
- All mood altering chamicals unless with a precaription from a qualified physicien and with prior approval from the Clinical Director.
- Drug paraphornalia such as pipes, syringes, literature, (magazines, books, and
- Phisworks of any kind.
- Amy and all video games.

10. Television and Video

At 9:00pm, radio, TV and all other noise must be turned down to a minimum. By midnight the television and radios should be turned off. At no time is it acceptable to keep the television on all might or all day. Members are NOT to He on or cloungs on the couch at any time whether the television is on or off. Violation may result in capulation from the house. Movie videos may be hought or rented. In general, movies that are permagraphic, overly violent, or glorify the "drug culture" will not be allowed. If you are a resident of the Women's and Children's transitional house, pleass note that only allowed in the badrooms. Please respect the TV rules or they will be modified. If you pans a shecial gime han used to major a monje' sis clear it migh gre pones wempets prior to your needs. Remember, TV is not a babysiner or to be on just for noise. It is important to learn bow to live without outside stimuli.

11. Smolding

Me are jearning to perome quak and alcohol tess. Zines micoque to a quak me abould open pe appe to nes the same tools we are learning to me brokern to pick the topeca habit. Using any tobacco products is only allowed outside. NO smolding in the house or on the balconies, porchen, decis, pados, or anywhere within 20 fest of the house! All digaratic butto must go in outside ashtrays. Do Not "Filck" these into the yerd or driveway. The smolding area must be kept clean at all times. Please empty butt cans at least once per day. Smolding areas need to be array from entrances to the houses at least so feet.

12. Voldec

Due to the limited perking at Slerra Resovery Center Transitional House, member will be permitted to been their vehicles at the house by permission only. All other members will have to find other options to store their vehicles or park elsewhere. Only those with current insurance, license and registration will be permitted to park at the house and you must provide proof of all of the items.

VIII. Children

Your children are your own responsibility. Supervision of your children is your responsibility and you may not expect other Hours members to supervise them. It is suggested that your children accompany you on audings, appointments, errands, etc., as much as possible. It is advised that attending 12-Step meetings, OF Groups and spoursor work he done without your children if at all possible to benefit your own recovery. Children need consistency and structure. Spanking and yelling at children is strictly prohibited, this includes any loud, angry voices or threatening tones. This behavior towards your children could cause termination from the house. Pleace remember we are mandated reporters and are required to report any concern of child p.m.! When your children get up in the morning you MUST also be up with him and/or her.

Di. Vicion

The only victors allowed in the House or on the House grounds must be pre-approved by your counselor. An Approved Victor Het will be maintained by the House Manager for each House member. Only those friends and relatives pulse are not providing alcoholics and/or substance almost a selection of the conditions.

Any House member has the right to ask visitors to leave the house if they are suspected of having consumed alcohol and/or drugs before visiting or their attitude is seen to be detrimental to one or more of the house members. No improper aboving of affection and mo visitors are allowed in the bedrooms. If a House member has a visitor they must motify the house who the person is and when they will be visiting. It is the House Manager's responsibility to insure that only those visitors on an Approved Visitor List are allowed in the House or on the property. There are no women in the mem's house and no men in the women's houses under any discumstances unless they are approved madiatenence people.

Moving Oms

When possible and/or approprists, dients have the option to make changes in their Hving arrangements.

The following rules are to be observed when moving out of the bome:

- o You must inform the House Supervisor that you are planning to move two weeks in advance.
- o Turn in your set of house keys the day you leave.

Cleaning Esfore Leaving

- The room is to be theroughly vacuumed.
- Surfacer deemed incirding windownine and doors.
- All pictures and postern not belanging to the house removed from walls.
- Any borrowed chesto, pillowesse, mattress cover and towels weahed and put away.
- Your applicand and refrigerator weeked.

The room will be inspected and any damage to formiture, carpete, sie, will be noted. If there is any damage to the room or the house caused by you, the cost will be deducted from your deposit or billed to you should your deposit not cover the demosses. If you fall to turn your est of house keys in, you will be charged for the cost of se-keying the house.

The calcty of all house members is of paramount importance. There are calcty features in your home such as locks and smoke detectors. Should they need replacement or repair, please notify the House Manager immediately.

Aon are reshowapple to prink hour own peqquer prese and tooq. Aon minet peeb the amount of items to a bars minimum. There is very limited space and carloads of belongings are more than the house can handle.

No pets are allowed in the T-Klouces.

All members will be required to perform house and grounds duties. This is not a hotel but a transition recidence where part of growth and moving out on your own is the obligation to keep your temporary home clean and functional. Each member must designate a replacement if shofte is washed of partiern assigned chorse due to an outride appointment, change in work rehedule or classes, or illness.

All chars are to be completed by 10:1000m or before leaving for work or celeal, and checked when returning to the bours. It is everyone's obligation to are to it that the Rouse remains clean. If a mounter see that an area needs eleming that is not their assigned chore, they are to clean it and inform the Rouse Supervisor.

ALL NOISE must be kept to a minimum after 9:00pm in consideration of those who wish to sleep or study.

Laundry is only to be done between 11AM and 9PM, unless other others are agreed upon by all members of the house.

We wish you to feel as much at home here as possible, but being a small community living together under one roof, we must follow certain rules and regulations.

- 1. No use or possession of drugs or alcohol in any form on or off the Premises.
- 2. No use of medication without a prescription. Before a Klouse member is prescribed medication, the physician must be informed that they are in recovery so that an acceptable medication can be prescribed. No marcodics or other mood altering medications unless by special permission. A medication prescribed to one member is never to be given to another. All medication will be kept in the member's room.

No association by phone or otherwise with known or suspected practicing alcoholics and/or drug addicts.

4. No intimate showings of affection with visitors while in the house (or on the property).

5. No weapons of any kind.

- No threats or acts of violence and no prejudicial remarks.
- 7. Members are required to inform the House Supervisor or Sierra Recovery Center staff of broken rules or intent to break rules.
- No trespassing. Bedrooms are private; no one is to be in another member's room without the occupant present.

9. No smolding tobacco in the House or on the property.

- 10. No borrowing without prior permission of owner. Stealing is a dismissable offence.
- 11. An attitude that is found to be detrimental to the Rouse or other member's will not be tolerated.
- 12. Proper, clean clothing will be worn at all times and proper, clean lairguage will be used on and off the premises.
- 13. Violation of curfews and not being where you say you are going to be is a dismissable offense.

14. No gambling in any form.

- 15. Ainy arrest by police officer or any violation of probation/parole may be considered a violation of the rules of Sterra Recovery Center Transidonal House and may result in expulsion from the House.
- 16. Termination of outpatient breatment or non-compliance with work and/or school requirements is cause for dismissal.

After this period, said effects may be given away, sold, discarded, or distributed to the remaining family members who need
Participation — That I agree to participate actively in the house meetings, outpatient counseling, vocational rehabilitation, and to maintain ongoing personal recovery, as long as this does not infringe on my personal rights.
Temporary Leave of Absence ~ Every effort will be made to maintain a house member's bed space in the event of a temporary medical, legal or personal absence. The duration of any such bed space reservation may be limited by the current waitlist but cannot exceed a weeks.
Re-Admittance ~ That if I am asked to leave Slerra Recovery Center Transitional House, I am required to wait a period of One (1) mouth before requesting re-admittance.
