My Name is Morgan DeRodeff, I am the son and grandson of the owners of the property at Wentworth Springs along the Rubicon Trail. I am writing you this evening because I will be unable to attend tomorrow's meeting and to ask that if seasonal travel restrictions are discussed or considered during tomorrow's meeting that you and the other supervisors vote to retain year round motorized access. My family and I are strongly opposed to any kind of seasonal access restriction. I would much rather see continued maintenance and erosion mitigation efforts where necessary to prevent any real erosion or soil damage. The winter travel up there is very minimal at this time and restricting access in the winter would obviously affect our ability to reach our cabin and property and enjoy the amazing experience winter travel provides. Restricting winter access would also inhibit a part of a possible business that we are considering starting on the property renting cabins for both summer and winter use. We want to make this a possibility again and winter access on the entire Rubicon Trail is very important to us in making that a reality.
