It is our mission to provide adult day services that enable impaired adults to function at their maximum level of independence in an atmosphere that provides the respect and care they deserve, while emphasizing a positive self-image and belief in the possibility of improvement through continued stimulation of body, mind and spirit and to reduce the burden experienced by their caregivers through respite, education and support.

Briefly describe organization's services:

Senior Day Care Services of El Dorado County (SDCS) provides non-medical (social) adult day services to people who are partially or totally dependent on others for their care due to physical, emotional, mental or cognitive impairments. SDCS specializes in meeting the needs of individuals in all stages of Alzheimer's disease or related dementia.

1. Brief overview of the program:

The creation of the "University" is in response to our rural community's need for a reliable, timely and easily accessible source of information, support and education for individuals with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia, their families and health care professionals. The "University" will include our three existing monthly caregiver support groups plus the "Dementia 101 Series" and "Memory Loss Information & Screening" events. The "Dementia 101 Series" will be held three times per year and includes three consecutive weekly classes - 1) Dementia 101, an overview of dementia; 2) Dementia Behavior 101, understanding and coping effectively with dementia behaviors; and 3) Caregiver Empowerment, learning how to thrive despite the tough journey. Each class will be taught by a top dementia care expert. The "Memory Loss Information & Screening" events with also be held three times each year and will feature a presentation by an expert from the University of California Davis Alzheimer's Disease Research Center followed by confidential memory screenings. After the presentation and while the memory screenings are being conducted, attendees will have the opportunity to speak casually with representatives from various key agencies. 2. Objectives/goals of the program:

By December, 2011, it is our goal to have created a well respected, highly recognizable, and reliable "go-to" source for dementia education, information and support for individuals with dementia, their families and health care professionals in El Dorado County and beyond.

3. Statement of need for this program:

Due to the rural nature of El Dorado County and its predicted 142% increase in Alzheimer's cases (by 2030), reaching everyone with the need for dementia education is an enormous task. The local Family Caregiver Support Program (FCSP) provides four educational courses each year, falling far short of the community's need. The SDCS University will fill in the gap by offering six more educational events each year creating timely access to information and support for the community. Receiving a diagnosis of AD can be devastating for both the individual and his/her family. Therefore, it is imperative we act now to meet the growing need for support through the long and most difficult dementia journey.

4. Brief description of how funds will be used:

If awarded, the funds will be used to create and maintain the SDCS University Program. They will be used to cover an on-going and comprehensive outreach/marketing plan including the cost of radio and newspaper advertising, a mailing campaign and the development and printing of flyers and brochures. In addition, funds will be used to cover speaker fees and honorariums, postage, classroom supplies, mileage reimbursement and other printing costs including classroom handouts/materials, surveys and memory screening forms.

The program will be open to the public. There will be no eligibility requirements.

9. Qualifications of the person(s) administering this program:

Wanda Demarest, who has been the Supervisor for the Senior Day Care Services Program since its inception in 1989, will administer the SDCS University program. In addition to providing dementia specific care, support services and education, Wanda has a Bachelor of Science degree in Organizational Behavior and over thirty-five years of supervisory and management experience.

10. How will you evaluate the effectiveness of the program?

Through the use of classroom surveys, the effectiveness of the program will be evaluated according to the degree in which the following anticipated outcomes are met. 1) 95% of attendees will report overall satisfaction with each class/event. 2) By the end of the first year, 2 or more attendees of each class/event will have been referred by physicians and/or other health care professionals. 3) 95% of attendees will report the class/event to have been helpful to them. 4) A minimum of 10 individuals will attend each class/event.

11. How will you fund the program once this grant ends?

In an effort to stretch the AFA start up grant, a donation of \$10 per class/event will be requested. In addition to seeking other sources of monetary contributions, we will seek on-going in-kind donations for such expenses as refreshments, printing and supplies.
