Revise the first sentence under CONSTRUCTION in Section 10-1.09 Portable Changeable Message Signs, to read as follows: The Contractor will be required to place and operate the portable changeable message signs at the construction site for seven (7) days prior to the start of the project.

		Answer: The areas for replacement have been marked in the field by the Engineer per Attachment C of the Contract Documents. Before any replacement work begins, the Contractor and the Engineer will meet on site to review the areas marked in the field.

		Answer: All grindings shall be hauled to and stockpiled at DOT's Headington Road yard. Replace the first sentence at the top of page SP-47 under Section 10-1.11 "Replace Asphalt Concrete Surfacing" with the following: Haul and stockpile removed material to the DOT maintenance yard at 2441 Headington Rd, Placerville. Coordination for disposal at the DOT maintenance yard must be made with Don Spear at (530) 641-4908.

		Answer: The payment clause for Section 10-1.14 "Shoulder Backing" is revised to read as follows: The final pay contract price paid per cubic yard for Shoulder Backing shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in constructing shoulder backing, complete in place, including furnishing, placing, maintaining, and removing portable delineators, W8-9 (LOW SHOULDER) signs, and temporary supports or barricades for the signs, as shown on the plans, as specified in the Standard Specifications and these special provisions, and as directed by the Engineer.
2.06	AP-38 and AP- 39	Question: Is Section 39-1.12 of the Amendments to the Standard Specifications applicable to this project? Will the finished overlay be profilographed?
		Answer: Only the straightedge specifications of section 39-1.12 apply to this project. The Contractor must meet the straightedge test criteria after overlaying those areas of the existing pavement that currently meet the straightedge test criteria and after overlaying the areas to be cold planed. The County understands that portions of the existing road do not currently meet the straightedge test criteria and will not meet these criteria after the overlay is placed. The Contractor shall identify and notify the Engineer of those areas that do not and will not meet the straightedge test criteria.
