ORDINANCE NO. 5189

AN ORDINANCE ADDING EL DORADO COUNTY ORDINANCE CODE TITLE 9 - PUBLIC PEACE, MORALS AND WELFARE CHAPTER 9.56. – SYRINGE EXCHANGE PROGRAMS, PROHIBITING NEEDLE EXCHANGE OR DISTRIBUTION PROGRAMS WITHIN THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO

WHEREAS, pursuant to the County's police power, as granted broadly under Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution and Section 210 of the Charter of the County of El Dorado, the Board of Supervisors of the County of El Dorado has the authority to enact and enforce ordinances and regulations for the public peace, health and welfare of the County and its residents; and WHEREAS. Government Code Section 25845 authorizes the County, through its legislative body, to declare actions and activities that constitute a public nuisance; and WHEREAS, the improper collection and disposal of used hypodermic needles and syringes is inimical to, and presents an imminent threat to, the health, property, safety and welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, a collection of needles and syringes near streams, rivers, lakes, and other waterways presents a threat to the health, property, waterways, safety and welfare of the public as they recreate and in the event of high-water levels; and WHEREAS, the County is in a public health crisis due to increasing overdose deaths, and the operation of a needle exchange or distribution program increases the risk of overdose and death by facilitating the use of deadly and dangerous synthetic opioids. like fentanyl. which can be hard to detect and drug users can be unaware that the drugs they ingest contain fentanyl, and can be lethal in doses as small as a few grains of salt; and

WHEREAS, syringe exchange programs that provide services near schools, parks and playgrounds have especially negative effects since they result in improper disposal of syringes and the congregation of persons addicted to drugs near schools, parks and playgrounds;

increase in the number of syringes and other drug paraphernalia found in its public places, specifically its main County Library, as residents of the County's emergency shelter leave during the day to receive supplies from a syringe exchange program and are stashing these supplies in the landscape around the Main Library. The Main Placerville Library is a vital resource for families and the presence of syringes and pipes is a public safety hazard; and WHEREAS, absent a local regulation, a needle exchange or distribution program may be operated in virtually any location within the County; and WHEREAS, the operation of needle exchange or distribution programs carries the risk of negatively impacting the goals of the County's General Plan including, but not limited to, Goal 6.6 to decrease the risk of exposure to hazardous materials and hazardous waste; and WHEREAS, this ordinance is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because there is no possibility it will have a significant effect on the environment, and it is not a "project", as defined in Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO DOES **ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. El Dorado County Ordinance No. 5188 is hereby repealed in its entirety and is of no further force and effect, effective as of the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 2. El Dorado County Ordinance Code Title 9 - Public Peace, Morals and Welfare, Chapter 9.56 - Syringe Exchange Programs, is hereby added as follows:

Chapter 9.56 - SYRINGE EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Sec. 9.56.010. - Purpose and Intent.

The board of supervisors recognizes that the establishment and operation of a syringe exchange program will increase improperly disposed needles which pose a serious risk to the public health, safety and welfare,

"Syringe exchange program' means any and all needle and syringe exchange or distribution programs or projects whereby hypodermic needles and/or syringes are exchanged or dispensed such that persons participating in and/ or operating such programs are exempted from criminal prosecution for acts related to the possession of needles and/or syringes

Sec. 9.56.030. - Public Nuisance. It shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to create, establish operate conduct or participate in a svringe exchange program within the unincorporated areas of the County of El Dorado. Sec. 9.56.040. - Enforcement.

Α. Administrative citations. violation of any provision of this chapter shall constitute grounds for issuance of a notice of violation and assessment of an administrative fine by the County. The County's procedures on imposition of administrative fines as set forth in Chapter 9.02 of the County Code are hereby incorporated in their entirety, as modified from time to time, and shall govern the imposition, enforcement, collection, and review of administrative citations issued to enforce this chapter and any rule or regulation adopted pursuant to this chapter, except as otherwise indicated in this chapter. B. Penalty for violation. Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished according to the general penalties described in Chapter 1.24. Each person is guilty of a separate offense for every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of this chapter is committed, continued or permitted by such person. The penalty shall be in addition to any civil or administrative remedy provided for by this chapter.

C. Other remedies not precluded. Nothing in this section is intended to preclude alternate enforcement mechanisms under other applicable laws. The remedies identified in this chapter are in addition to and do not supersede or limit any and all other remedies, civil or criminal, available at law or in equity.

Sec. 9.56.050. - Conformance to Law.

The provisions of this chapter shall be interpreted in accordance with otherwise applicable state and federal law(s) and will not apply if determined by the county to be in violation of any such law(s)

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Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force thirty (30) days after the date of its adoption. The Clerk is directed to publish this ordinance, or a summary thereof, within fifteen (15) days in accordance with Government Code section 25124.
