#### III. Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 – (Recipient Handbook, Section 2152)

## VI. Debarment and Suspension - (Recipient Handbook Section 2155)

Cal EMA-funded projects must certify that it and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, sentenced to a denial of federal benefits by a state or federal court, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal department of agency.

## VII. Proof of Authority from City Council/Governing Board

The above-named organization (applicant) accepts responsibility for and will comply with the requirement to obtain written authorization from the city council/governing board in support of this program. Furthermore, it is also agreed that grant funds received from Cal EMA shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by the city council/governing board.

The applicant is required to obtain written authorization from the city council/governing board that the official executing this agreement is, in fact, authorized to do so. The applicant is also required to maintain said written authorization on file and readily available upon demand.

#### VIII. Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Fund

The grant recipient administered the grant in accordance with the VOCA, the VOCA Program Guidelines, and the Office of Justice Programs Financial Guide.

#### IX. VOCA Recovery Fund

If the recipient received VOCA Recovery funds, it certifies it did comply with the following Special Conditions:

- **Limit on Funds.** The grant recipient understands and agrees that this award was subject to the provisions of the Section 1604 of the Recovery Act. No funds were appropriated or otherwise made available in this Act were used by any State or local government, or any private entity, for any casino or other gambling establishment, aquarium, zoo, golf course, or swimming pool.
- Buy American Notification (Use of American Iron, Steel, and Manufactured Goods). The grant recipient understands and agrees that this award was subject to the provisions of the Section 1605 of the Recovery Act. No funds were appropriated or otherwise made available by the Act were used for a project for the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of a public building or public work, unless all of the iron, steel, and manufactured goods were used in the project were produced in the United States.
- Wage Rate Requirements. The grant recipient understands and agrees that this award was subject to the provisions of the Section 1606 of the Recovery Act. App.) and section 3145 of title 40, United States Code.
- Access to Records, Interviews. The grant recipient understands and agrees that federal DOJ (including OJP and the Office of the Inspector General [OIG]), and its representatives, and the Government Accountability Office (GAO), shall have access to and the right to examine all records (including, but not limited to, books, papers, and documents) related to each Recovery Act award, including such records of any subrecipient, contractor, or subcontractor. The recipient also understands and agrees that DOJ and the GAO are authorized to interview any officer or employee of the recipient (or of any subrecipient, contractor, or subcontractor) regarding transactions related to this Recovery Award.
- Separate Tracking and Reporting of Recovery Act Funds. This condition also applies to any subrecipients. - DUNS and CCR Reporting. The grant recipient understands and agrees to Reporting and Registration Requirements under Section 1512 of the Recovery Act. (a) This award requires the recipient to complete projects or activities that are funded under the Recovery Act and to report on use of Recovery Act funds provided through this award. Information from these reports will be made available to the public. (b) The reports are due no later than 10 calendar days after each calendar guarter in which the recipient receives the assistance award funded, in whole or in part, by the Recovery Act. (c) Recipients and their first tier recipients must maintain current registrations in the Central Contractor Registration (www.ccr.gov) at all times during which they have active federal awards funded with Recovery Act funds.
