This gross inequity must be addressed by physically placing at least one Full-Time "Health Navigator" in EDH to serve this end of the county. (The Plan currently calls for 2 positions to be located in South Lake Tahoe and 2.2 positions to be located in Placerville .)

Why do I believe this is important? As the Executive Director of the the Vision Coalition of El Dorado Hills, I am a strong supporter of the hard work of Chris Kondo-Lister, Deputy Director, and Neda West Director. We have been working hard as well to support their efforts by obtaining community assessment information needed for policy decisions, and by writing and receiving federal and foundation grant funds that we manage. In the last year alone, we have held Town Hall meetings on Mental Health and Behavior Health, Underage Drinking, Prescription Drug use, and Capacity Bullding. At each meeting we receive recommendations from the community. Each meeting shows a need for services and suggestions for services. As our representatives on the Board of Supervisors, we appreciate that you and our Mental Health Director and Deputy Director, have attended many of our community events and meetings. I apologize that I cannot attend every County Mental Health meeting, however my community liaison, Della Clavere, and I have attended many of them over the last 4 years.

In summary: I and many of our coalition members in El Dorado Hills oppose the Innovation Plan, unless amended. I spoke by phone with Sophle Cabrera, (Project Lead for the Innovation Workplan for El Dorado County, who indicated and that it was not intentional to omit El Dorado Hills as a target community for these services and that she is willing to make the needed amendments. I plan to attend the meeting on May 17 and would like to speak before the board and get your support to make the needed amendments to the plan.
