It is noted that El Dorado Hills is included in the "Western Slope". However, much like Georgetown, EDH is too far (18 miles) to realistically benefit from services provided in Placerville. El Dorado Hills needs to be identified specifically as a target population so that it can receive funding for these vital health services.

Therefore, I highly recommend that the Innovation Work Plan be amended to address the disparity in services provided per capita. According to the 2010 census EDH has 42,108 and Cameron Park

18,228 (totaling 60,330), six times the Placerville population of 10,389, almost three times the S. Lake Tahoe population of 21,403 and 25 times the Georgetown population of 2,367! This gross inequity must be addressed by physically placing at least one Full-Time "Health Navigator" in EDH to serve this end of the county. (The Plan currently calls for 2 positions to be located in South Lake Tahoe and 2.2 positions to be located in Placerville.)
