**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the El Dorado County Health and Human Services Agency will conduct a public hearing at 9:00 a.m., or as soon thereafter as it can be heard, on Tuesday, March 27, 2012, in the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors' Chambers, at 330 Fair Lane, Placerville, as part of the closeout process for the State Department of Housing and Community Development Fiscal Year 09-10 Community Development Block Grant Planning Technical Assistance (CDBG PTA) General Allocation Grant 09-PTAE-6497, to discuss the Exterior Housing Conditions Study and to solicit citizen input.

The purpose of this public hearing will be to notify the public of the outcomes and accomplishments funded by the Fiscal Year 09-10 CDBG PTA grant and for the Board of Supervisors to accept the final product.
