Under Item 42, you have before you Resolution 053-2014 to dissolve the El Dorado County Trails Advisory Committee, as well as the Sacramento-Placerville Corridor Oversight Committee, being recommended by the El Dorado Parks & Recreation Commission. Change is good, that is why there are elections, but advisory committees and commissions are volunteers trying to help bring about change through elected officials. Out with the old, in with the new.
