



Hello Kerry

I wanted to respond by telling you my rescue animal stories. Since living in El Dorado County I have been the beneficiary as I will call myself, of 5 dogs and 6 cats. My adoptions of animals have been from a combination of local rescue organizations, the Animal Services organization and most recently, El Dorado Pet Club. All of these organizations are vital to our local pets and their ability to live out their lives with people who love them. I always check the Animal Shelter listings to see if there are any that would fit well into my life and that of my present pets.

My first dog I found on the El Dorado Bike Trail and took him to the Animal Services. After a bit of research and trying to find the owners, I ended up adopting him myself. This dog turned out to be an Australian Terrier which I had never heard of before. He was so smart and so loved by our family, that I ended up purchasing an Australian Terrier from a breeder. We had both of them for many years, all bringing us great joy.

Second and Third dogs came to me from the German Shepherd Rescue of Shingle Springs. Their previous owner went to prison (someone unknown to me at the time) and it was supposed to be a temporary foster stay. However I ended up having both dogs until their respective passing - the first being 6 years from the date I took them both in.

She is currently on thyroid meds but otherwise in perfect health and everyday I feel blessed to have her in my life and grateful I can give her a good home until her final days.

Fifth dog I adopted just recently from El Dorado Pet Club, a black lab named Rosco. He is also 10 years old and according to the vet also in excellent health. Every day this dog smiles, dances and loudly slaps his tail on the floor when he sees me. I look forward to this summer when we can enjoy the Lotus park and river walks.

Over the years I have also adopted cats through the animal shelter as well as the cat rescue on Enterprise Drive. I currently have 2 cats that were adopted one from the animal shelter in Placerville and one from Auburn shelter.

Without the services of EDC Animal Services these wonderful animals would be put to an untimely death. All life is precious, including those of our beloved pets. Education targeted at the grade school and middle school levels is vital to encourage responsibility regards to these beautiful living beings. They are not disposable and without the shelter they would be put to death without a chance to be adopted by those of us who want to care for them. I currently have 3 dogs and 2 cats. My home is full now but I will always look to the animal services organization to adopt those needing a home when the time is right. Please keep this vital service available to all.




