Dear Supervisors,

Honorable Members,

It has come to my attention that the current Marijauna Ordinance is to Sunset, and the Board is considering comments today.

I am a resident of Somerset. In the last two years, Residents of Happy Valley Road have experienced a dramatic increase in the number of cars using Happy Valley Road. Few people live here yet there is at least 30 more cars a day on the road than before the Ordinance was passed. It has become a major road hazard as these people do not know how to drive the road. There has been an increase in accidents. I have seen trucks filled with manure, water barrels and hoses in the Spring. In the fall the smell of harvest is awful.

More worrisome is the amount of fertilizer that is running off into the Consumnes River. I have observed bright green algae growing in the River the last two Summers. There are far fewer trout in the deep pools.

There is an impact on the wildlife as well as many deer are being shot. I have called Fish and Wildlife on more than one occasion to pick up dead deer. My dogs brought home 4 carcass this year alone. None of which were skinned or butchered.

This indicates to me that in my neighborhood; people are growing Marijuana for more than personal use. The vagueness of the Ordinance has allowed for an unlimited amount of plants for personal use. Marijuana growing has become a for profit business, and is not for compassionate use as originally intended.

It is my opinion that the ordinance be allowed to Sunset, then review the current policies and craft more comprehensive procedures to police the activity.
