RE: CAO Update

• Inc. Fastest-growing Companies: Two El Dorado County companies have been recognized on Inc. magazine's annual list of the country's 5,000 fastest-growing companies. Placerville-based Stem Express was ranked #363 on the list, with 1316% 3-year growth. Vista Imaging Services, based in El Dorado Hills, was ranked #802 with 567% 3-year growth.

• Senior Day Care Celebrates 25th Anniversary with Open House: The Health & Human Services Agency invites the community to celebrate 25 years of service of the El Dorado County Senior Day Care Program. The community is invited to an open house and on Thursday, September 18, 2014, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the Senior Day Care Center located at 935A Spring Street in Placerville.

The Senior Day Care Center in Placerville first opened its door on August 28, 1989, and in early 2014, the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors demonstrated its ongoing commitment to the senior population by expanding the program to include a Senior Day Care Center in El Dorado Hills. The centers provide care and activities for adults needing supervision during the daytime hours. Most clients are older adults who are isolated or whose quality of life has been compromised by a chronic health condition such as Parkinson's disease, stroke, Alzheimer's disease or related dementia. Activities at the centers include group exercise, crafts, modified sports, speakers, live music and field trips. Supportive services, education and referrals are also available for members and their families.

The September 18 open house and 25th anniversary celebration at the Placerville Center will include live music, refreshments, and a short program with speakers, tours of the facility and more. For information about the event or Senior Day Care Services, call (530) 621-6180.

• Mental Health Move: Health & Human Services' Mental Health division in South Lake Tahoe opens in its new location at 1900 Lake Tahoe Blvd. on September 8.

• Notice of Vacancy: Clerk of the Board Jim Mitrisin announced that the El Dorado County Early Care and Education Planning Council is accepting applications for board membership to fill two vacancies serving at the discretion of the Board of Supervisors. Successful applicants would be those who are concerned about and/or experienced with child care and early education issues. • **Parking Lot Rehab:** The Facilities Division started a parking lot rehabilitation project for Buildings A & B on Monday through Sunday, August 25-31. This project will be done in phases so it's important to pay attention to the signage and cones. Work will be performed after hours but all vehicles, materials and equipment within specified sections should be moved out each night no later than 5:00PM as directed by specific signage and cone zones. Parking will be available at the library for employees that will be working past 5:00PM. Only certain sections will be closed down at a time so a majority of the lot will be available during the process. Facilities appreciates everyone's patience with the project, which should be done in roughly one week. Once the paving work is complete the contractor will come back within a week to restripe.

• Successful Mainframe Conversion: The Information Technologies Department has successfully completed the Mainframe conversion. The migration of data from the old Shark Data Storage Unit to the new DS8870 Data Storage Unit was completed resulting in approximately 3 terabytes of data being moved between the two units. The conversion of the Mainframe and the Data Storage Unit has also significantly improved performance. Our back-ups are now completing approximately 5 hours sooner than they did on the old equipment. The final step is to surplus the old Data Storage Unit. IT will be working with the Procurement office to surplus this equipment. Interim IT Director Kelly Webb would like to recognize and thank Walter Davies, Tom Bullock and Russ Barnes from the IT Department for their hard work and effort in making this a smooth and successful transition.

• Stormwater Experts: Our own Russ Wigart, Stormwater Coordinator for the Tahoe Basin was asked by the EPA Chief Administrator for the Pacific Southwest to do a short presentation on the importance of maintenance and sweeping to Senator Feinstein and Governor Brown at the Tahoe Environmental Summit held last week. Russ teamed up with South Lake Tahoe and brought "our two best sweepers and a poster board with information." Russ and this team did a 10-minute joint presentation to describe how maintenance and operations should be a primary goal for the next round of Federal funding for Tahoe, if it is ever available. Maintaining existing stormwater systems and improving roads and road condition are the future to meeting the Lake clarity crediting goals. Senator Feinstein said she was going to look into funding for maintenance and wanted some numbers. She also said she appreciated Russ' passion. Russ and his supervisor Brendan Ferry are knowledgeable, respected and articulate individuals on Lake clarity and we are proud to have them representing our County.
