Dear Board of Supervisors:

This letter notifies you that the results of the Engineering and Traffic Survey (E&TS) performed by the Department of Transportation (Caltrans) indicate that the speed limits of the existing speed zones on State Highway 49 from PM 34.25 to PM 34.93 mph through the town of Coloma, El Dorado County, are not enforceable.

Based on this E&TS, we are proposing the following:

- 1. Eliminate the speed zone south of the red flashing signal at PM 34.46.
- 2. Increase the posted speed from 40 mph to 45 mph north of the red flashing signal from PM 34.46 to PM 34.92.

In accordance with Section 22354.5(b) of the California Vehicle Code, you have the opportunity to conduct a public hearing on the proposed speed limit change, if you so desire. If you choose to have a public hearing, we will try to be available to attend the meeting to answer any questions which may arise concerning the proposed speed zone change. We will not make a formal presentation or run the hearing.

Please check the appropriate statement on page two and sign, date, and return this letter to the address by February 16, 2015. If we have not heard from you by February 16, 2015, we will conclude a public hearing will not take place and we will complete the change to the existing speed zone.

SPEED ZONE JUSTIFICATION

This 0.68-mile long existing 40-mph speed zone traverses mostly commercial and open areas. The highway is two-lane conventional; with left and right turn lanes, in foothill terrain. There is a 3-way intersection control beacon at PM 34.46.

District Accident Records

There were a total of 2 recorded accidents in the three-year period from July 1, 2009 to December 31, 2011. The actual accident rate is 0.64 ACC/MVM (accidents per million vehicle miles) and the average rate is 1.34 ACC/MVM.

According to State accident records, the primary collision factors of the two accidents were driver falling asleep and failure to stop at a Stop sign.
